We have included these so that you can show prayerful concern for them as they, who like us are 'wearied by the changes and chances of this fleeting world' (as the prayer from Compline puts it), adjust to living in a time of global pandemic. You'll also find the usual things we would normally have: the feasts and commemorations from the lectionary, the Australian Cycle of Prayer, and commemorations from the United Nations calendar. All the material is designed to inform your prayers for our Overseas Partners, the bishops and dioceses of our Church and for wider global concerns. With the Psalmist let us pray, 'Let my prayer be counted as incense before you, Lord, and the lifting up of my hands as an evening sacrifice' (141.2).

Who are ABM's Overseas Partners?

HIS MONTH WE ARE ASKING YOU not only to remember our each of our Australian dioceses as they grapple with the Covid-19 pandemic, but also each of our each of our Overseas Partners as they deal with it too. Our Overseas Partners consist of Activity Partners (with whom we currently have joint activities), Relational Partners (with whom we have historical relationships) and Networking Partners (with whom we work overseas, or with whom we share information). We have, as the well-used Anglican phrase describes it, strong *bonds of affection* for all of them. Because our overseas work involves both the Church, through our Church-to-Church Unit, and communities, though our Anglicans in Development Unit, we often relate to our partners both through the Church itself and through a particular Church's community development arm. - ✤ Pray for the people of Ukraine as they face the needless destruction of their country, and for the people of Russia as devastation is caused in their name; for the people of Europe as the energy crisis looms large as winter approaches; for the people of Myanmar and all other places where the people are under military rule; for the people of Tonga as they continue to deal with the after-effects of the eruption of the volcano Hunga Tonga−Hunga Ha'apai; for places where Covid-infections are still high; for those who mourn those who have died of Covid, both here and overseas; for those in Pakistan and Japan dealing with devastating floods; for those in Australia dealing with flooding and its aftermath; for all who struggle with the rising cost of basic foodstuffs, rent or mortgage payments and fuel costs; for all who are homeless, especially those who are people living with disabilities.
- Give thanks for the saints in our own lives and for all who point us towards Jesus; for those opening their hearts and homes for Ukrainian refugees; for those rolling out the monkeypox vaccine; for the declining Covid-19 infection and death rates in most places throughout the world; for the State Emergency Services and all who help others during natural disasters in Australia; or the Australian government's commitment to end violence against women and children within the next generation.

- ✤ Thank God for a successful completion of the Week of Evangelism.
- ✤ Pray that people who were reached by the gospel would be able to remain in Christ for the rest of their life.
- ✤ Pray for the Diocese of Juba who will hold a special prayer on All Saints' Day all the Church will march from St John's Parish to the Cathedral. May God stand by his Church and bring back peace as the Church remembers its saints in South Sudan.
- Remember to pray for the upcoming Peace Conference in November which will bring people from many countries around the world to Juba.
- Also pray for the upcoming House of Bishops meeting on November 10-13 in Juba; Pray that the Lord will inspire his servant, the Primate with wisdom to lead this meeting successfully.
- ↔ Pray for reduction of flooding in many parts of South Sudan where people are in dire needs of food, shelter and health.

in Hong Kong improve such that the poor need not be forced to live in cramped subdivided flats.

✤ As the 20th National Congress begins for the CCP, may God grant them true wisdom, and lead them to walk a path that is pleasing to God's eyes.

- Give thanks for the youth of the NSKK as diocesan youth leaders meet this month to plan events for next year; ask God to bless and enable the younger generation to help revitalize an aging church.
- Please pray for all dioceses of the NSKK as they hold their diocesan synods this month, and ask God to inspire their discussions and decisions.
- Give thanks for Japan reopening its borders to visitors, but pray that the government and the church might always keep in mind and work to uphold the rights of all people, especially those of minority groups.
- Please pray for the Japanese government as it tries to resolve problems within the economy and for the Central Bank as it tries to support the Yen following serious weakening against other currencies, and all the issues this devaluation entails.

WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS IN THE AMERICAS. Large proportional increases in Covid case numbers have recently been seen in Honduras, Bermuda and Curaçao. Large numbers of new cases have been reported recently by the USA, Brazil and Chile.

Spread your protection over them, O Lord:

So that those who love your name may exult in you.

WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS AROUND THE EASTERN MEDITERRANEAN. Large proportional increases in Covid case numbers have recently been seen in Morocco and Kuwait. Large numbers of new cases have been reported recently by Qatar, Iran and the United Arab Emirates.

Spread your protection over them, O Lord:

So that those who love your name may exult in you.

WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS IN SOUTH-EAST ASIA. Large proportional increases in Covid case numbers have recently been seen in Timor Leste. Large numbers of new cases have been reported recently by India, Indonesia and Bangladesh.

Spread your protection over them, O Lord: So that those who love your name may exult in you.

WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS IN EUROPE. Large proportional increases in Covid case numbers have recently been seen in San Marino, Austria and Greece. Large numbers of new cases have been reported recently by Germany, France and Italy.

Spread your protection over them, O Lord: So that those who love your name may exult in you.

AND WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS IN OUR OWN REGION, THE WESTERN PACIFIC. Large proportional increases in Covid case numbers have recently been seen in Mongolia, Papua New Guinea and Singapore. Large numbers of new cases have been reported recently by China, Japan and South Korea.

Spread your protection over them, O Lord: So that those who love your name may exult in you.
