You'll also find the usual things we would normally have: the feasts and commemorations from the lectionary, the Australian Cycle of Prayer, and commemorations from the United Nations calendar. All the material is designed to inform your prayers for our Overseas Partners, the bishops and dioceses of our Church and for wider global concerns. With the Psalmist let us pray, 'Let my prayer be counted as incense before you, Lord, and the lifting up of my hands as an evening sacrifice' (141.2).

#### Who are ABM's Overseas Partners?

HIS MONTH WE ARE ASKING YOU not only to remember our each of our Australian dioceses as they grapple with the Covid-19 pandemic, but also each of our each of our Overseas Partners as they deal with it too. Our Overseas Partners consist of Activity Partners (with whom we currently have joint activities), Relational Partners (with whom we have historical relationships) and Networking Partners (with whom we work overseas, or with whom we share information). We have, as the well-used Anglican phrase describes it, strong *bonds of affection* for all of them. 


# The Episcopal Church of South Sudan

- We ask you to pray for security in many parts of South Sudan.
   Recently there were attacks by cattle raiders in Lomega Diocese that left about 8 deaths, with more than ten people wounded.
- Flooding is still serious in many parts of Upper Nile, Jonglei, and Eastern Bahr el Ghazal Internal provinces.
- Continue to pray for implementation of the Revitalized Peace agreement between SPLM in Government and SPLM in opposition.
- Pray that God prepares hearts for the Christmas season and the gospel to be heard.

# The Church of the Province of South-East Asia



- Thank the Lord for the peaceful 15th General Election of Malaysia, home to three dioceses in our Province, on 19th November even in the face of monsoon floods in certain parts of the nation. Voter turnout was 73%.
- Pray for political stability of Malaysia, as election results rendered a hung parliament. Ask for God's mercy and intervention of the Lord.
- Pray for harmony among the people of Malaysia as racial and religious sentiments were stroke during the 15th General Election. Pray against violence and hatred among followers of different religions.
- We rejoice at the Province's 1st ordination of an Indonesian priest at Church of Christ the King of kings in Nunukan, Kalimantan on 4th December 2022. Pray for safe travel as the Provincial leadership converges on Nunukan.
- Pray for the nations in our Province as the people combat against rising costs of living, food and fuel prices. Pray for the emotional and spiritual wellbeing of all those who suffer economic hardship.

WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS AROUND THE EASTERN MEDITERRANEAN. Large proportional increases in Covid case numbers have recently been seen in Somalia, Sudan and Morocco . Large raw numbers of new cases have been reported recently by Qatar, Bahrain and the United Arab Emirates.

WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS IN EUROPE. Large proportional increases in Covid case numbers have recently been seen in North Macedonia, Andorra and Monaco. Large raw numbers of new cases have been reported recently by Germany, France and Italy.

Spread your protection over them, O Lord: So that those who love your name may exult in you.

WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS IN SOUTH-EAST ASIA. Large proportional increases in Covid case numbers have recently been seen in Timor-Leste and Indonesia. Large raw numbers of new cases have been reported recently by Indonesia, India and Thailand.

Spread your protection over them, O Lord: So that those who love your name may exult in you.

AND WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS IN OUR OWN REGION, THE WESTERN PACIFIC. Large proportional increases in Covid case numbers have recently been seen in French Polynesia, Tuvalu and New Caledonia. Large raw numbers of new cases have been reported recently by Japan, South Korea and China.

Spread your protection over them, O Lord: So that those who love your name may exult in you.
