Who are ABM's Partners?

- ★ We pray for farmers and people living and working in rural communities which are facing drought.



The Episcopal Church in the Philippines

- Give thanks for the award of Trinitian Fellow 2024 to the Most Rev Brent Harry W Alawas by the ECP's Trinity University of Asia on the occasion of its 61st Founding Anniversary, and pray that this honor will open more opportunities to proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom to the wider academic community.
- Give thanks for the long-term visit to the ECP's Saint Andrew's

 Theological Seminary of Dr Paulo Ueti, Anglican Communion Advisor on Theological
 Education & Interpretation/Translation, and pray that this opportunity to teach in the
 Philippines will inspire new appreciation for the Bible and the good news that it
 brings.
- ♣ Pray for the communities affected by flooding across Mindanao, especially for the ongoing emergency relief efforts.
- Pray with the National Council of Churches in the Philippines that the Philippine government will stamp out corruption, boost local agricultural production through genuine agrarian reform, deliver basic social services, and protect national sovereignty; and that the public will refrain from signing the current petition for a Charter Change to the 1987 Philippine Constitution being promoted at the wrong time, for the wrong reasons, and through deception.
- Give thanks for the successful solarization project at St Vincent's Episcopal Church in Tabuk City established under the ECP Decarbonization Program which has already reduced its carbon footprint by 37%, and pray for the success of more projects to achieve the ECP's target of net zero Greenhouse gas emissions.



The Episcopal Church in South Sudan

- Let us continue to pray against violence in Unity state where Cattle raiders kill two men in Mayom, took 50 cattle and abducted two children, according to a senior state government officials.
- Let us pray for proper funding of justice institutions in the country as United Nations Human Rights Commission in

South Sudan lamented the ineffective presence of judiciary in most parts of the country due to lack of resources.

- Let us pray for justice institutions to be in a place to address the persistent human rights violations; the widespread of sexual and gender-based violence, child and women abductions and inter-communal violence.
- Let us continue to pray against cattle raiding in Lakes state as a police sergeant in Malek Payam of Rumbek Central County was killed during an attempted cattle raid by armed raiders, Let us pray for the police to identify and apprehend the perpetrators and bring them to book.
- Let us continue to pray against cattle raiding in Jonglie state where at least five people were killed, a girl child abducted, and 200 cattle raided in a separate attack by armed youth in Akobo and Uror Counties of Jonglei State, according to an official.
- Let us continue to pray against the increase of child and women abduction in Jonglie and Greater Pibor Administrative area that leads to killings, forced marriages, sexual slavery, and even trafficking by armed youth.
- Let us pray for UN Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS) that is helping the humanitarian response by ensuring a consistent protective presence through patrols in the area and fostering harmonious relationships between host communities and new arrivals along the border between South Sudan and Sudan given that scarce resources are bound to cause friction.
- Let us continue to pray for peace in Sudan as South Sudan urge African Union (AU) intervention to restore peace and stability in Sudan.
- Let us to pray for peace in Sudan, as conflict continues unabated in Sudan, the influx of returnees and refugees continues into South Sudan. Every day, the transit camp in Renk receives between 1,000-1,500 new arrivals, according to a humanitarian worker.

WEEK 1

A Prayer for the Leadership of the Church and the Nations

Remember your leaders, who spoke the word of God to you. Consider the outcome of their way of life and imitate their faith.

— Hebrews 13.7

In this fourth month of the year, we invite you to join us to pray for the Province of the Democratic Republic of Congo (with extension of ministry into Congo Brazzaville). Let us lift up prayer of thanksgiving for the Primate, the Most Rev Dr Andre Titre George, his College of Bishops and others who share the leadership of the church in these troubled regions of D.R. Congo and Congo Brazzaville. Lift up prayer for the national, community and sectional leaders who together with the church work towards the peace of the nations and provide accountable leadership and stewardship of God's people in the resource-rich countries. Join us to pray for wisdom and for any virtue that these leaders need to lead the people of faith and none and that enlightened by the Holy Spirit, they will pursue justice, peace and respect for each other in their various faith, clan and sectional communities. Join us to pray for godly leadership in the missional, institutional and socio-economic development projects in all diocese in the two countries.

WEEK 2

A Prayer for Mercy, Healing and Fruitfulness

Behold, I will bring [to them] health and healing, and I will heal them and reveal to them abundance of prosperity and security.

— Jeremiah 33.6

In the second week of April, we pray that God will remember his word through the prophet Jeremiah and bring health and healing, prosperity and security to the nations of D.R. Congo and Congo Brazzaville. We pray that God's permanent healing will be bestowed on traumatized persons and communities affected by the incessant fighting among the various armed groups, people displaced by the crises of war and natural disasters and for the many women, girls, elderly and vulnerable children and elders who face all forms of abuse and for young maidens who become sex slaves to the armed rebels.

We remember and pray for the many Internally Displaced Persons and refugees from the two countries and continue to remember and pray for migrant workers and various categories of people from the various countries in other places across the globe. We pray that these persons will contribute to the fruitfulness of the economies of their host nations, foster healing, and healthy relations and that they will live in harmony with their host communities and show mercy one to another. Let us pray for the various health and healing ministries of the Church and for all whose work brings healing and restoration to the sick, the traumatized and those challenged emotionally and psychologically.

WEEK 3

A Prayer for Peace

Finally, brothers and sisters, rejoice! Strive for full restoration, encourage one another, be of one mind, live in peace. And the God of love and peace will be with you.

-2 Corinthians 13.11

This third week of April we invite you to pray for the peace of the nations of the Democratic Republic of Congo and Congo Brazzaville. We pray for God's peace to undergird and rule in the church and in the nations and for the pursuit of justice and godly actions in governance, commerce and trade, education and life molding actions and within the judiciary. Let us pray for peaceful social and political relations between various ethnic groups and peoples in the two nations especially for the tensions between the armed groups and government forces. Pray for the work of the United Nations Mediation Team and for all other interest groups in the resource-rich countries that they will value the sacredness of human life, respect the rights of all persons and work towards peaceful dialogue of their differences devoid of personal interest but rather seek for the betterment of the nations and her people. Let us pray for security in Eastern Congo and Plymouth areas and for the efforts of the Church to provide support for the affected persons.

WEEK 4

A Prayer for Love

Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God.

— 1 John 4.7-8a

For the fourth week of the month, let us join together to pray for endearing love among the various faith, tribal, sectional and political communities in the countries of the Democratic Republic of Congo and Congo Brazzaville. Let us pray that all people in the constituent dioceses and communities of the province will bear the burden of loving another and experience same in their personal and communal lives even as they undertake their various missions and ministries. Let us pray that the actions and thoughts of leaders and members of the church and communities will be directed by love for one another

regardless of gender, ethnicity, creed, and nationality; that the mission of the church will be motivated and undergirded by genuine love for all people of faith and none, acknowledging that all are created in the image and likeness of our Sovereign God. Pray for all who are socially disconnected, lonely and without any social connection or support.

Additional Prayers

Thanksgiving and Celebration

- We join the Church of Nigeria to give thanks and praise to God for their 45th Anniversary of being a full province within the Anglican Community. Until 1979, the Church of Nigeria was part of the Church of the Province of West Africa which was made up Nigeria, Ghana, Liberia, Sierra Leone, Guinea and The Gambia. On February 24, 1979, with 16 dioceses Nigeria became an independent province with Archbishop Timothy O. Olufosoye as the Primate and Metropolitan Archbishop of the province. As at today, the Church of Nigeria has 161 dioceses under the leadership of the current Primate and Metropolitan Archbishop Henry Ndukuba. Let us celebrate the Lord's goodness on the Church of Nigeria.
- Join us to give thanks to God for the success of the Evangelistic Revival crusade in the Diocese of Rokon in South Sudan. The four-days programme was attended by over 3,000 people from all parts of South Sudan and neighbouring countries of Uganda and Congo. Seven Bishops from different dioceses attended the conference.
 - The closing day of the conference was attended by the Vice President of the Republic, Dr. James Wani Igga, Governor of the Central Equatoria State, Hon. Emmanuel Adil Anthony, Commissioner of Juba County Eng. Charles and two other Commissioners from Western Equatoria State. The aim of the Revival conference was to bring people to listen to God's words of salvation, to pray for healing in the land and to pray for peace and reconciliation.
- Let us join the Diocese of Akoko (Church of Nigeria) to give thanks to God for the successful completion, consecration and opening of the new Cathedral Church of St. Stephen in Ikare. The service was attended by a cream of Bishops from the Church of Nigeria.
- Give thanks to God for protection and journey mercies for Archbishop Ezekiel Kondo (Episcopal Church of Sudan) during his pastoral visit to his members in the Nubia mountains.
- We stand in prayer of thanksgiving with Bishop Sergio Bambo, Bishop of the Anglican Diocese of Tete (Igreja Anglicana de Moçambique e Angola, the Anglican Church of Mozambique and Angola) as he opened and closed the Diocesan CCMP training and commissioned the first batch of the Facilitators in the Diocese.

New Ministries

- We give thanks and commit to God our dear Brother and Father-in-God, the Rt. Rev. Stafford Moses who has been consecrated as the Third Bishop of the Diocese of False Bay of the Anglican Church of Southern Africa. Bishop Stafford is married to Bishop Yvette Moses of the Cape District of the Methodist Church of Southern Africa. The consecration service was presided over by His Grace Archbishop Thabo Makgoba of the Anglican Church of Southern Africa and Presiding Bishop Pumla Nzimande of the Methodist Church. "Their marriage across racial, nationality and church barriers has always cemented ecumenical and cross-cultural partnerships wherever they have served. Today that partnership is taken to another level and shows what Jesus truly yearns for That they may be One. (John 17:21)" We stand with them in prayer.
- Give thanks to God for the election of four new Bishops in the Church of Nigeria. The newly elected Bishops are: the Venerable Owen Ukafia (Diocese of Uyo), the Venerable Nuhu Yohanna (Diocese of Katsina), the Venerable Matthew Ogaze (Diocese of Ogbia), and the Venerable Ikechukwu Egbuonu (Diocese of Oji River). Please stand with them in prayers as they prepare to take up their new pastoral and episcopal roles and to join the College of Bishops within God's Holy Church in Nigeria.
- Let us give thanks and pray for the commencement of ministry of the newly preferred Honorary Canons of the Cathedral Church of Saints Alban and Matthew in the Anglican Diocese of Tema (Church of the Province of Ghana). The new Honorary Canons and their Stall names are: the Ven Kofi deGraft-Johnson (St Francis of Assisi), the Rev Canon Jacob Teye Botchway (St Augustine of Hippo), the Rev Canon Christian Kalitsi (St Ambrose), the Rev Canon Major Richmond Clottey (St. Athanasius), the Rev Canon Michael Anang-Aboh (St Boniface), the Rev Canon Eric Agba (St Anthony of Padua) and the Rev Canon Frances Quist (St Catherine of Alexandria).
- Join us to pray for the ministries of the newly installed Lay Ministers in the Diocese of Mthathia in the Anglican Church of Southern Africa. Please pray for greater anointing and grace for ministry and discernment of their individual and corporate call to ministry.
- → Join the Province of Indian Ocean and in particular the dioceses in Madagascar who
 (through their Primate) share their story of gratitude for the generous support they
 received during the period of natural disasters and famine that hit the country last

Despite the military intervention and mediation efforts, calm has still not returned to the region which faces recurrent insurrections and incessant attacks of residents.
- The Provincial Office gives thanks to God that The Anglican Church in Congo is generally functioning well, despite the insecurity in the country. They ask that wepray that God will give wisdom to politicians to put an end to the war in Congo.
- Pray that God will help the Archbishop of the Anglican Church of Congo and the members of the Provincial Office by providing them with the material and financial resources they need to carry out their activities.
- Pray for the resources of transportation, equipment and other resources to enable the relocation of the Provincial Secretary from Bunia for Kinshasa.


