Who are ABM's Partners?



- ♣ Protection for Youth: Many young people are attempting to evade conscription laws by fleeing to neighboring countries, often without proper documentation. Pray for their safety and for their parents, who are experiencing immense distress.
- ♣ Archbishop's Safety: Pray for the Archbishop, who leads the Christian Peace Supporting Committee and faces threats to his life.
- Construction Projects: CPM has to build a church, an Anglican Peace Center, and a parsonage on government-donated land. These projects are to be completed within four to five years, despite lacking firm financial security. Pray for the necessary resources and support.
- **Christian Unity:** Pray for all Christian churches in Myanmar to unite in Christ.



The Episcopal Church in the Philippines

- Give thanks for the successful installation of the Most Rev Nestor D Poltic as the eighthth Prime Bishop of the Episcopal Church in the Philippines (ECP), and pray that the bonds of friendship expressed by both local ecumenical partners and international partners within the Anglican Communion will continue to strengthen and bear fruit as together we strive to proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom to all people in all places.
- Pray for a continued intensification of activities towards the ECP's thrust to be a Scripture-rooted, Spirit-fired and Discipled Church, especially through increasing bible studies, numbers of lay ministers, and people pursuing theological studies.

- Give thanks for The Communion Forest initiative, especially for the recent ecumenical mass mangrove planting activity in the ECP Visayas Missionary Diocese with the Iglesia Filipina Independiente at the Barangay Tabon Coastal Area in Batan, Aklan, and pray for continued ecumenical and community collaboration as together we strive to safeguard the integrity of creation, and sustain and renew the life of the earth.

WEEK 1

A Prayer for the Leadership of the Church and the Nations

With upright heart he shepherded them and guided them with his skillful hand,

- Psalm 78.72

We come into the fourth month of the year with grateful hearts and to lift up fervent and incessant prayers to God as we bring before Him the Province of Congo under the Most Rev Dr Andre Titre George. We remember and pray for the College of Bishops, Clergy and Lay Leaders who (together with the Primate) provide both spiritual and temporal leadership to the members of the Church and their communities. We remember in our prayers the national leadership in the Congo and in all the other places where the ministry of the Church is shared. We pray for unity and single-mindedness among the ministers (both the ordained and lay) and also among the political, social and tribal leaders who, together with the church, work towards the well-being of the people, their prosperity and the peace of the nation. Join us to pray that the leaders (both spiritual and temporal) will be guided by wisdom to provide accountable leadership and stewardship and be enlightened by the Holy Spirit in their pursuit for justice, peace and respect for each other in their various faith and tribal communities.

WEEK 2

A Prayer for Mercy, Healing and Fruitfulness

Those who are planted in the house of the Lord shall flourish in the courts of our God. They shall still bear fruit in old age; they shall be fresh and flourishing, to declare that the Lord is upright; He is my rock, and there is no unrighteousness in Him."

- Psalm 92.12-15

In the second week of April, we pray for fruitfulness, good health and mercy for God's people in the Province of Congo and within the boundaries of the country of the Democratic Republic of Congo. We pray for the constituent dioceses of the province and the provinces of the country. We pray that the country and its peoples will increase and multiply in all their undertakings and be healed of all their infirmities and diseases. We pray for God's mercy and healing of the trauma suffered by the many families and communities

affected by the ongoing conflict, especially in the eastern part of the Congo and those who have been affected directly and indirectly by the political and economic instability in the country. Join us to pray for the safety of women, young girls, children and the elderly who areadversely impacted by the conflict and for those who have been displaced in neighbouring countries. Join us to pray for the various health and humanitarian ministries of the Church and for all those whose work and ministries bring healing and restoration to the sick, the traumatized and those challenged emotionally and psychologically within the dioceses of the province and their communities.

WEEK 3

A Prayer for Peace

And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

- Philippians 4.7

In the third week of the month, we invite you to join us to pray for the peace of the Church and the country of the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Weprayforthepeaceful co-existence of the various political, tribal and faith groups in the country and their neighbours especially the Republic of Rwanda, whose support for theM23rebel group is of grave concern. We pray for all whose efforts and actions engender peace among the people and faith groups and pray for God's peace to undergird the ministries and mission of the Church and in the nation and for the pursuit of ustice and godly actions in governance, commerce and trade, education andl ife-moulding actions and within the various institutions of the nation and the Church. We pray that the country of the Democratic Republic of the Congo and its neighbours will know and experience the peace of Christ in their challenging political and socio-economic circumstances. We pray for peaceful social and political relations between the various ethnic groups and peoples as well as political parties and faith groups in the country and for the betterment of the nation and its people.

WEEK 4

A Prayer for Love

Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love.

- 1 John 4.7-8

In the fourth week of April, we join together to pray for enduring love among the various tribes, communities and the members of the various dioceses of the Province of Congo and in the country. Join us to pray for love among people of differing faith, tribes, and political and economic affiliations in the constituent dioceses and the country of the Congo. We pray that all people of faith and none will bear the burden of loving one another and experience the same in their personal and communal lives even as they

undertake their various missions and ministries in love and in service to each other. We pray that policies, programmes, actions and thoughts of leaders and members of the church and other faith communities, as well as those of the political leadership, will be directed and motivated by love for one another regardless of gender, ethnicity, creed, and nationality; that the mission of the church will be motivated and undergirded by genuine love for all people of faith and none, acknowledging that all are created in the image and likeness of our Sovereign Lord. Pray for all who are socially disconnected, lonely and without any social connection or support.

Thanksgiving and Celebration

- - We join the Rt Rev John Kafwanka and the members of the Standing Committee of the Anglican Diocese of Northern Zambia to give thanks to God for the success of their first meeting in 2025. The meeting received and approved reports of activities and mission developments in all Archdeaconries, Committees and across ministries (MU, MAF, Youth, St Veronica). The Standing Committee also approved the process to develop a Five-Year Strategic Plan, which aims to draw contributions from all ministries and Archdeaconries. Join us to pray for grace as this process of Strategic Plan development gets underway.
- Anglican Diocese of Mauritius Province of the Indian Ocean
 We join the Rt Rev Joseph Stenio Andre, his family and the Anglican Diocese of
 Maurius to give thanks to God for the Fifth Anniversary of his Episcopacy in the
 Diocese. The Diocese of Mauritius is one of the eight (8) dioceses in the Indian Ocean
 province. Bishop Joseph Stenio Andre took over from the Most Rev Ian Ernest, the
 immediate past Director of the Anglican Centre in Rome, who was also the Primate of
 the Church of the Province of the Indian Ocean. The Anglican Church has been in
 Mauritius since 1854 and as we thank God for Bishop Stenio, we pray for God's
 blessings on his family, ministry and the Church.
- ♣ Anglican Church of Southern Africa
 We join the Anglican Church of Southern Africa (ACSA) to thank God for the success
 of the Episcopal Synod during which a Communique was released requiring every
 parish in the province to appoint Safeguarding Officials who will be dedicated to
 keeping people safe from abuse. The synod, held in Benoni, Gauteng, South Africa
 from 22 to 26 February, also approved the preparations towards the Elective
 Assemblies for the Dioceses of Pretoria and Port Elizabeth whose Bishops retired
 since the last General Synod in September 2024. The Episcopal Synod also prayed for
 the Rt Rev Steve Moreo, Bishop of the Diocese of Johannesburg who attended his
 last meeting of the ACSA Synod of Bishops before his retirement later in the year.

The Archbishop and Primate of ACSA, the Most Rev Dr Thabo Makgoba assisted by the Dean of the Province, the Rt Rev Stephen Diseko prayed for the retiring bishop. We wish Bishop Moreo well in the next phase of his personal, family and ministerial lives.

 We join the St Nicholas Seminary community, the Board of Governors, Faculty and
 Seminarians to thank God for the act of benevolence received from the National
 Council of the Anglican Women's Fellowships (AWF) who as part of their annual visit
 to the seminary donated an amount of GHC 60,000 towards the completion of the
 Female Hostel block in the seminary. While thanking the AWF, we kindly invite other
 benevolent groups in and outside Ghana to come to the aid of the Seminary. We pray
 for God's blessings on the mission and ministry of the AWF and for the growth and
- The Diocese of Luapula, Zambia Church of the Province of Central Africa
 We join the Church of the Provinceof Central Africa (CPCA) under the leadership of
 the Most Rev Albert Chama, the College of Bishops and the Councils of Registrars
 and Chancellors and all the members of the Standing Committee to give thanks to
 God for the success of the meetings of the Provincial Standing Committee and the
 Episcopal Synod during which the Very Rev Japhet Pondan was elected as the
 Second Diocesan Bishop of the Luapula Diocese in Zambia. Before his election, the
 Very Rev Pondan was the Dean of the Cathedral Church of Michael and All Angels in
 the Diocese of Northern Zambia. Our prayers are with Very Rev Pondan, his family
 and the Diocese of Luapula as they prepare towards his Episcopal Ordination,
 Consecration and Enthronement at a date to be announced.

Various Prayers

Anglican Diocese of Goma – Province of the Congo

expansion of its ministries.

We lift up prayer for the worsening humanitarian situation in the eastern province of the Democratic Republic of the Congo as fighting between the national army and the rebel group, M23 escalates. In a statement issued in the early days of the fighting, the Anglican Bishop of Goma, the Rt. Rev. Martin Gordon described people as being "terrified in their homes" as fighting continues to escalate. The Bishop called on the international community to act immediately and decisively for peace in Eastern DRC. Bishop Martin described the situation in the city of Goma as having "...no power and many areas with no water. The M23 seems to have control of large parts of the city. The Congolese army are resisting in other areas. Civilians are being caught in the crossfire. Bodies are lying in the streets." Reports monitored so far indicate a grave humanitarian situation with over 3,000 people confirmed dead and over 35,000 people displaced both within the Congo and in neighbouring countries of Burundi, Tanzania and other countries, with some swimming across dangerous waters to try to get away from the ravaging war.

★ The Impact of the Closure of the USAID Projects

Please pray for all Anglican development work across the continent which is losing USAID funding so suddenly leading to loss of jobs, food, medication and other critical support for thousands who depended on USAID-supported projects. From Kenya, the Executive Director of Kenya's Anglican Development Services (ADS), revealed that USAID's abrupt exit has seriously affected the organization with a loss of KShs 200million [\$1,550,387] USAID annual support. He indicated that ADS's income is at its lowest, including that which caters for anti-retroviral drugs for communities ravaged by HIV/AIDS. "We don't know how to continue; 150 of our staff members have been affected. We have put them on unpaid leave as we figure a way out." Health, economic empowerment, HIV prevention, referrals to HIV facilities, smart farming for food security, climate change, orphans and vulnerable children are some of the development agency's programmes that have been affected by the sudden closure of USAID funding.

Join us to pray for peace, justice and tranquillity amidst the political wranglings between the various political parties, the National Assembly, the Senate and the various Arms of Government which is adversely affecting the ordinary citizen. The ever-rising cost of living, high taxes and levies keep pushing people at the margins over the economic cliff affecting especially those in the informal sector. The legal battles between the Judiciary Service Commission and the beleaguered Judges of the Supreme Court and other legal battles involving different arms of government threaten to grind the wheels of governance to a screeching halt. Let us pray "that God will guide the President and give him wisdom and justice; that God's ministers will serve him faithfully and His royal people joyfully that in the valley of the shadow of death, God will protect his people with his rod and staff and as trees planted by the waterside, God will grant His people thefruit of the Spirit and send them out as the salt of the earth and the light of the world." (Excerpts from Our Modern Service Prayer Book, Anglican Church of Kenya).
