## Who are ABM's Partners?


### **EACH DAY THIS MONTH**

- ✝ We pray for people in Aotearoa New Zealand who are homeless and vulnerable and struggling in the middle of a very wet winter.

Thank you for the churches and social agencies which do what they can to help and assist.

- ✝ We pray for people in the Tasman District especially who have lost homes and livelihoods as a result of recent flooding. We give thanks for churches and Christian agencies like Common Grace Aotearoa which are committed to pushing decision makers to do more to combat climate change.
- ✝ We give thanks for the Diocese of Polynesia and the work it is doing in partnership with Anglican Missions to replenish pre-positioned supplies in Fiji and Tonga which are used to support impacted communities to get back on their feet following emergencies.
- ✝ We pray for Dioceses and Hui Amorangi as they start preparing for annual Synods and we give thanks for all the good work the Anglican Church is involved in and for lives being changed.
- ✝ And we continue to pray for everyone caught up in the atrocities of the conflict in Gaza. - ✠ In the heat of summer, we pray for all who work outside and that their health and welfare is adequately considered by their employers.






## The Episcopal Church in Jerusalem and the Middle East

- ✠ Pray for clergy and parishioners of Holy Family Catholic Church in Gaza, which was attacked on 17 July. Three people died and others were injured.
- ✠ Pray for the peace of Jerusalem.

Pray also for all the staff, teachers, and volunteers preparing for the camp, that they may be equipped with God's wisdom and strength to prepare everything well. Above all, pray for the safety and well-being of all the children, that they may enjoy this time with joy and peace, free from any accidents.
- ✠ **Mothers' Union 100th Anniversary Celebration** Please pray for the upcoming 100th Anniversary Celebration of the Mothers' Union of the Anglican Church of Korea on 20 September, as well as for all the preparations. Pray for the members of the 100th Anniversary Planning Committee and Fr Francis, the chaplain, who are faithfully fulfilling their roles despite the hot and humid weather. Above all, pray that this celebration may bring great glory to the Lord and become an opportunity for all Mothers' Union members to grow in unity.

- ✠ **Summer Programs and Retreats in Local Churches:** Please pray for the various summer programs, retreats, and camps being organized by local churches, groups, and associations across the Anglican Church of Korea. Pray that people of all ages – from children to seniors – may walk with the Lord, discover His truth, and experience deeper unity within their communities. Pray also for the priests and leaders who are preparing and guiding these programs, that they may receive renewed strength and grace from the Lord, and that these gatherings may be times of spiritual refreshment and oneness with God.

- ✠ Give thanks for the youth who are active in the Samahan ng Kabataang Episcopal sa Pilipinas (SKEP) national youth organization and pray for their more intentional and programmatic involvement in the work of The Episcopal Church in the Philippines, especially in areas that are within their expertise.
- ✠ Give thanks for the nursing scholarship program of the Carl Russel Trust and pray that the six scholarship recipients will successfully complete their studies and effectively respond to human need by loving service through the nursing profession.
- ✠ Give thanks for the continued commitment of The Episcopal Church in the Philippines to support the Episcopal CARE Foundation's asset reform program of distributing land to landless tenants for residential purposes and pray for further efforts to achieve social justice among economically marginalized communities.



- ✠ Give thanks for the advocacy of the Ecowaste Coalition and pray that newly elected local government officials will uphold the human right to a clean, healthy, and sustainable environment, including enforcing zero-waste programs, rejecting incineration projects, expanding green spaces, protecting watersheds, and ensuring the safety of waste workers and environmental defenders.

### Prayer Focus this month: The Anglican Church of Kenya

#### WEEK 1

##### **A Prayer for the Leadership of the Church and the Nations**

*Pay careful attention to yourselves and to all the flock, in which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to care for the church of God, which he obtained with his own blood.*

– Acts 20.28

Welcome to the eighth month of the year, as we invite you to join us in giving thanks to God for bringing us to the second half of the year; for all his mercies towards us even as we invite you to join us in praying for the Anglican Church of Kenya (ACK) under the Most Rev Dr Jackson Ole Sapit. Join us to remember and pray for the College of Bishops, Clergy and lay leaders who (together with the Primate) provide both spiritual and temporal leadership to the members of the Church and their communities in Kenya. We remember in our prayers the national political leaders and all those to whom leadership responsibilities have been entrusted. We pray for unity and single-mindedness among the ministers (both the ordained and lay) and also among the political, social and tribal leaders who, together with the church, work towards the well-being of the people, their prosperity and the peace of the nation. Join us to pray for wisdom, accountable leadership, and stewardship, that, enlightened by the Holy Spirit, all leaders in Kenya may pursue justice, peace, and respect for one another in their various faith and tribal communities.

#### WEEK 2

##### **A Prayer for Mercy, Healing and Fruitfulness**

*Beloved, I wish above all things that thou mayest prosper and be in health, even as thy soul prospereth.*

– 3 John 1.2

In the second week of August we pray for fruitfulness, good health, and the mercies of God for the people of Kenya and in all the place where the ministry of the Church reaches.

We pray that the people will increase and multiply in all their undertakings and be healed of all their infirmities and diseases. We pray for God's mercy and healing of the trauma suffered by the many families and communities affected by the various economic and political challenges in Kenya and for those devastated by incessant insurgency in border counties, and for those affected by human and natural disasters in the country. We pray for political and economic stability in Kenya and for the safety of women, youth, children, and the elderly who are adversely impacted by challenges caused by the effects of climate change, political instability, and other challenges. Join us to pray for the various health and humanitarian ministries of the Church and for all those whose work and ministries bring healing and restoration to the sick, the traumatized and those challenged emotionally and psychologically within the dioceses of the province and their communities.

### **WEEK 3**

#### **A Prayer for Peace**

*You keep him in perfect peace whose mind is stayed on you, because he trusts in you.*

– Isaiah 26.3

In the third week of the month, we invite you to join us in praying for peace in the Church and the counties that make up the province and the nation. We pray for the peaceful coexistence of the various political, tribal, and faith groups in the country of Kenya. We pray for all whose efforts and actions engender peace among the people and faith groups, and we pray that God's peace would undergird the ministries and mission of the Church and the nation, and for the pursuit of justice and godly actions in governance, commerce and trade, education, and life-molding actions within the various institutions of the nation and the Church. We pray that the country and the Church will know and experience the peace of Christ in their political and socio-economic circumstances, and for peaceful social and political relations between the various ethnic groups and peoples, as well as political parties and faith groups, for the betterment of the nation and its people.

### **WEEK 4**

#### **A Prayer for Love**

*Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love.*

– 1 John 4.7-8

In the fourth week of August, we join together to pray for enduring love among the various tribes, communities, and the members of the dioceses of the Anglican Church of Kenya. We pray for love among people of differing faith, tribes, and political and economic affiliations in the constituent dioceses and counties of Kenya, that all people of faith and none will bear the burden of loving one another and experience the same in their personal and communal lives, even as they undertake their various missions and ministries in love

and in service to each other. We pray that policies, programmes, actions, and thoughts of leaders and members of the church and other faith communities, as well as those of the political leadership, will be directed and motivated by love for one another regardless of gender, ethnicity, creed, and nationality; that the mission of the church will be motivated and undergirded by genuine love for all people of faith and none, acknowledging that all are created in the image and likeness of our Sovereign Lord. Pray for all who are socially disconnected, lonely and without any social connection or support.

## Additional Prayers

### Thanksgiving and Celebration

#### ✠ *Agents of Change Training – Ghana Cohort*

We Join us to give thanks to God for the success of the first of the three sessions for the Ghana Cohort of the Agents of Change training that took place at the Anglican Retreat Centre, Accra, from 22 to 29 June this year. The training brought together 54 trainees from 12 out of the 13 dioceses in the Internal province of Ghana and was hosted by the Anglican Diocese of Tema under the leadership of the Rt Rev Dr George Kotei Neequaye. The six-day training witnessed the unearthing of talents, dreams of transformation and flourishing churches, and inspiration of the trainees to go back to be agents of change and transformation in their communities and dioceses. The training was organized by the Anglican Alliance in collaboration with CAPA.

#### ✠ *Agents of Change Training – Malawi Cohort*

Join us to give thanks for the Malawi Cohort of the Agents of Change training which took place in Blantyre, Malawi, from 3 to 8 July. We thank God for journey mercies for the 30 participants and facilitators who travelled from the Dioceses of Upper Shire and Southern Malawi and the facilitators from the Anglican Alliance, UK.

#### ✠ *Anglican Diocese of Northern Zambia*

We join the members of the parish of St Luke (consisting of St Luke, Lwangwa, St Mary Magdalene, ZamTan, and St Thomas, Kamfinsa) in the Diocese of Northern Zambia, to give thanks for the success of the admission of 45 new members to the Sacrament of Confirmation and the induction of the Fr Ben Joe Mwenya as Priest in Charge of the parish. We pray for the newly confirmed persons that they will be grounded in their faith and for the parish to be intentional in their discipleship efforts.

#### ✠ *Church of Uganda – Anglican Communion*

Join us to pray for the profound transformation, steadily dismantling centuries of male-dominated leadership within the Uganda Anglican Church. Since the arrival of Christianity in the late 1800s, women within the church have largely been involved in supportive, often unseen roles. However, a quiet transformation is now unfolding,

challenging deeply ingrained cultural norms and propelling women into increasingly prominent positions. A major departure from tradition is evident as women increasingly ascend to high ranking offices within the Anglican Church. While the episcopal bench remains exclusively male for now, women are already serving as provosts, deans, diocesan treasurers, and heads of laity. This progress builds on the efforts of trailblazers such as the Very Rev Canon Dr Rebecca Margaret Nyegenye, who in 2019 became the first female Provost in the Church of Uganda. More recently, Professor Elizabeth Kukunda Bacwayo of Uganda Christian University was elected Head of Laity in the Kampala Diocese, and the Very Rev Canon Dr Joy Mukisa Isabirye made history as the first woman Dean in the Busoga Diocese.

## In Memoriam

✠ *Home call of the Most Rev Bernard Ntahoturi, former Primate of Burundi, former Chairman of CAPA, and former Director of the Anglican Centre in Rome*

We join together to pray for the repose of the soul of an iconic church leader not only in the Anglican Church of Burundi but also within CAPA and the Anglican Communion - the Most Rev Bernard Ntahoturi. He was the Chairman of CAPA from 2012 to 2016 and was appointed the Director of the Anglican Centre in Rome and the Archbishop of Canterbury's representative to the Holy See in 2017. CAPA joins all the faithful in Burundi and the Anglican community in Africa to pray for the wife and children and for the church in Burundi. He was laid to rest on 2 July 2025 in his home community. May his gentle soul rest in peace and rise in glory.
