#### WEEK 1

### A Prayer for the Leadership of the Church and the Nations

Remember your leaders, who spoke the word of God to you. Consider the outcome of their way of life and imitate their faith.

— Hebrews 13.7

Welcome to the month of December, the last month of the year. In this month, we kindly invite you to join us in giving thanks to God for bringing us this far in the year and to lift up prayer for the Church of Uganda under the primacy of the Most Rev Dr Stephen Samuel Kaziimba Mugalu. Join us to remember and pray for the College of Bishops, Clergy and lay leaders who, together with the Primate, provide both spiritual and temporal leadership to the members of the Churches and their communities in Uganda. We remember in our prayers the national and political leaders and all those to whom leadership responsibilities have been entrusted. We pray for unity and single-mindedness among the ministers (both the ordained and lay) and also among the political, social, and tribal leaders who, together with the church, work toward the well-being of the people, their prosperity, and the peace of the nations. Pray for wisdom, accountable leadership, and stewardship, and that, enlightened by the Holy Spirit, all leaders in Uganda will work toward the pursuit of justice, peace, and respect for one another in their various faith and tribal communities.

#### WEEK 2

### A Prayer for Mercy, Healing and Fruitfulness

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God.

—1 Cor 1.3-4

In the second week of the month, join us to pray for fruitfulness, good health, and the mercies of God for the people of Uganda and in all the place where the ministries of the Church reach. We pray that the people will increase and multiply in all their undertakings and be healed of all their infirmities and diseases. We pray for God's mercy and healing of the trauma suffered by the many families and communities affected by conflicts, tribal infractions, and economic and political challenges, and for those devastated by continued fighting between various groups in northern Uganda. We pray for political and economic

stability and for the safety of women, youth, children, and the elderly who are adversely impacted by the challenges caused by the effects of the conflicts, political and economic difficulties exacerbated by the activities of armed bandits and other issues. Join us to pray for the various health and humanitarian ministries of the Church and for all those whose work and ministries bring healing and restoration to the sick, the traumatized and those challenged emotionally and psychologically within the dioceses of the provinces of Uganda and their communities especially for the various groups of people who are taking refuge within the borders of Uganda.

### WEEK 3

### **A Prayer for Peace**

I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world, you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world.

— John 16.33

In the third week of December, we invite you to join us in praying for peace in the provinces, dioceses, and communities that make up the country of Uganda. We pray for the peaceful coexistence of the various political, tribal, and faith groups in Uganda and for all whose efforts and actions engender peace among the people and faith communities. Join us to pray for PEACE in the period before, during, and after the national elections slated for 15 January 2026. We pray that God's peace would undergird the ministries and mission of the Church and the nation, especially those mediating for peace and for the pursuit of justice and godly actions in governance, commerce and trade, education, and life-molding actions within the various institutions of the nation and the Church. We pray that Uganda and its faith and tribal communities will know and experience the peace of Christ in their political and socio-economic circumstances, and for peaceful social and political relations between the various ethnic groups and peoples, as well as political parties and faith groups, for the betterment of the nation and its people.

### WEEK 4

### **A Prayer for Love**

And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony

- Colossians 3.14

In the fourth week of December, we come together to pray for enduring love among the various tribes, communities, and the members of the dioceses of the Church of Uganda. We pray for love among people of differing faith, tribes, and political and economic affiliations in the constituent dioceses and provinces of Uganda, that all people of faith and none will bear the burden of loving one another and experience the same in their personal and communal lives, even as they undertake their various missions and ministries in love and in service to each other. We pray that the policies, programmes, actions, and thoughts of leaders and members of the church and other faith communities, as well as those of the political

leadership, will be directed and motivated by love for one another regardless of gender, ethnicity, creed, and nationality; that the mission of the church will be motivated and undergirded by genuine love for all people of faith and none, acknowledging that all are created in the image and likeness of our Sovereign Lord. Pray for all who are socially disconnected, lonely, and without any social connections or support.

of fourteen newly created dioceses The Primate of the Church of Nigeria, Anglican Communion, the Most Rev'd Henry C Ndukuba, led other Archbishops and Bishops to consecrate fifteen newly elected bishops on Sunday 9 November at a service held at the Cathedral Church of the Advent, Lifecamp in Abuja. These new dioceses and the newly elected bishops were

- the outcome of the Episcopal Synod held on Thursday 18 September at the Cathedral Church of Emmanuel, Okesha, Ado-Ekiti, in Ekiti Diocese. The consecration service confirmed the new episcopal leaders for these Dioceses after which the Primate proceeded to inaugurate fourteen out of the fifteen newly created Dioceses in the Church of Nigeria. Join us in praying for these new leaders of Christ's Church.
- **Church of Uganda (Anglican Communion)** +‡+ Join us to pray for the Rt Rev Prof Dr Grace Lubaale, Bishop-elect of the Diocese of Busoga, who has been appointed by the Archbishop of the Church of Uganda, the Most Rev Dr Stephen Samuel Kaziimba Mugalu, to coordinate and strengthen the Pastors' Children Network (PK Network) across the Province. The announcement was made during the GSFA New Bishops' and Spouses' Formation Retreat at Lweza, where the Archbishop emphasized leadership, mentorship, and the family as the foundation of ministry. Pray for this new ministry in the Church of Uganda and in the Diocese of Busoga.
- +‡+ Anglican Diocese of Wanyjok (Episcopal Church of South Sudan) Join us to give thanks and celebrate the Rev Canon James Dut Majok who has been officially announced as the Archdeacon of Wunlang Archdeaconry in the Diocese of Wanyjok in South Sudan. Anglican Diocese of Northern Zambia (Church of the Province of Central Africa)

the Country Director of the Zambia Anglican Council Outreach Program (ZACOP) as

- Anglican Diocese of Upper Shire (Church of the Province of Central Africa) +‡+ 18 October is marked globally within Christian circles as St Luke's Day, to commemorate the ministry of Luke, the Apostle and the Patron Saint of Health Workers and Institutions. We join the Anglican Diocese of Upper Shire in Malawi, under the leadership of the Rt Rev William Mchombo who led the commemoration of the day at the St Luke's Hospital and College of Health Sciences in Malosa in the Diocese of Upper Shire. The occasion was marked by the recognition of the exceptional contributions of staff and students to the ministries of the hospital and the college. At the celebration of the Eucharist, the Bishop, in his homily, encouraged the hospital staff to emulate the example of St Luke, who took care of those in need irrespective of class, tribe, gender, or race, and extended help with empathy and humility. As we thank God for the ministry of St Luke's Hospital and College of Health Sciences, join us in praying for all other health ministries of the various dioceses of the Anglican Communion and those within various communities of our parishes, dioceses, and provinces.
- Under a partnership between the Zambia Anglican Council and the Diocese of Bath and Wells, the leadership of the Anglican Diocese of Northern Zambia handed over 50 citrus trees to the leadership of the Kamakonde Primary School for their new orchard, with more trees expected to be planted during the rainy season. This effort is to boost the green credentials of the school and to support the Creation Care priority of the Diocese. As we join the Diocese of Northern Zambia to give thanks, we celebrate their efforts and those of all parishes, dioceses, and provinces in their contributions to the 5th Mark of Anglican Mission and to the ministry of Creation Care. May the Lord pour rain on these and other seedlings and raise caretakers for these seedlings.

### **Updates and Upcoming Events**

- → Tanzania: We invite you to join us in praying for peace in Tanzania. Killings took place following the disputed poll at the end of October. Pray for the repose of their souls.
- Diocese of Eswatini CCMP Champions: We stand in prayer and in celebration with the CCMP Champions in the Zandondo, Hhohho and the Usuthu Mission parishes who are living out the mantra of CCMP "right knowledge in the head, Christ in the heart; food on the table; money in the pocket; right relationships with God, neighbours and the environment." Join us in thanking God and celebrating the initiatives of these parishes in expanding their garden initiatives. The Usuthu Mission parish has harvested their beans and have received an order to supply 5000 heads of cabbage to Smiling Through. They have since commenced the planting of two hectares of beetroot ahead of the festive season. We say a big thank you to the Diocesan Bishop, the Rt Rev Dr Dalcy Dlamini and the Archdeacons for their personal involvement and encouragement.
- Anglican Development Services, Eastern (Kenya): Join us to stand in prayer for the ministry of the Anglican Development Services, Eastern, as they commence the construction of sand dams that will provide water for communities in arid parts of eastern Kenya. These communities are in hard to reach places with very low chances of getting government assistance to develop their water sources. These projects are being supported by the Australian Board of Mission in collaboration with Anglicans in Development, who are partners of ADSE. Join us in praying for the success of the initiatives and for the safety of the workers during the construction of the dams. Join us in thanking God for the success of the 19th AGM of the ADSE and the launch of their new strategic plan.

- Anglican Church of Southern Africa: The Provincial Standing Committee of the Anglican Church of Southern Africa has resolved and requested all dioceses to take key actions, including preparing a disaster readiness plan and setting aside parcels of land as part of their commitment to the Communion Forest Initiative. In a statement issued at the end of their deliberations and signed by the Primate, the Most Rev Dr Thabo Magkoba, the province noted the imperative to act as the Southern Africa region is facing the triple planetary crises of climate change, pollution, and biodiversity loss. Join us in praying for their resolve to carry through the decisions made during the meeting.
- Jamaica, the Dominican Republic and Haiti: We invite you to join us in offering prayers for our brothers and sisters who have been affected by the devastating impact of Hurricane Melissa, remembering those sheltering from the storm, the first responders and emergency workers, and all those whose efforts in the current circumstances provide hope and protection for children, the elderly, and the most vulnerable in these countries. Pray for the long road to recovery and reconstruction. May the Lord come through for them especially for the residents of Blackriver Town in Jamaica, which has been completely destroyed.
