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Who are ABM's Partners?

- ✙ Pray for a massive increase of food, potable water, fuel, and medical supplies for the civilians inside Gaza.
- ✙ Pray for a successful negotiated release of all captives, including any still being held in Gaza and the 11,000 being held as political prisoners in Israeli detention camps.
- ✙ Pray for Holy protection against settler violence in the West Bank, especially for the Christian village of Taybeh, which has been the subject of many recent attacks.
- ✙ Pray for justice for Layan Nasir and Shadeh Khoury who face many months of military detention on false charges.
- ✙ Pray for a speedy end to the war and a rapid movement towards a just and lasting peace in the Holy Land, under an equitable Two-State solution.
