WEEK 1

A Prayer for the Leadership of the Church and the Nations

Where there is no guidance, a people falls, but in an abundance of counsellors there is safety. – Proverbs 11.14

Welcome to the fifth month of the year in which we invite you to stand with us as we pray for the Church of the Province of Central Africa. We lift up prayer of thanksgiving for the Primate, the **Most Rev Albert Chama**, his College of Bishops and others who share the leadership of the church in the constituent dioceses in Botswana, Malawi, Zambia and Zimbabwe. Join us to pray for the national, community and sectional leaders in the countries of the province, who together with the church, work towards the peace of the nations and provide accountable leadership and stewardship of God's people. Join us to pray for wisdom and for any virtue that these leaders need to shepherd the people of faith and none and that enlightened by the Holy Spirit, they will pursue justice, peace and respect for each other in their various faith, clan and sectional communities. Join us to pray for godly leadership in the missional, institutional and socio-economic development projects in all dioceses in the province and in the countries that constitute the province.

WEEK 2

A Prayer for Mercy, Healing and Fruitfulness

But the sons of Israel were fruitful and increased greatly, and multiplied, and became exceedingly mighty, so that the land was filled with them. – Exodus 1.7

In the second week of the month, we pray that God will make his people in the churches in Botswana, Malawi, Zambia and Zimbabwe to be fruitful, to increase and multiply and be healed of all their infirmities and diseases. We pray for God's comfort and restoration for those who were affected by the floods in the Kaonga and Nkhotakota districts in the Northern and Central Lakeshore regions of Malawi, for the drought stricken country of Zimbabwe, that the Lord will pour rain on their land and cause the land to be fruitful as he assured Isaac in Genesis 26. Let us pray for fairness in the various food aid distribution initiatives in Zimbabwe. We pray for the many

young people who out of frustration and despair have taken to drugs and substance abuse and other anti-social behaviours in Zimbabwe that the Lord will come through with the right counselors for them and heal them. We remember and pray for the many people who have migrated from their communities to seek greener pastures both within and outside their countries, that the Lord will shepherd them through wise counselors and prudent leadership of their nations and communities. Let us pray for the various health and healing ministries of the Church and for all whose work brings healing and restoration to the sick, the traumatized and those challenged emotionally and psychologically.

WEEK 3

A Prayer for Peace

Peace, I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid. – John 14.27

This third week of May, we invite you to pray for the peace of the constituent nations and dioceses of the province. We pray for God's peace to undergird and rule in the church and in the nations and for the pursuit of justice and godly actions in governance, commerce and trade, education and life molding actions and within the judiciary. Let us pray that all the countries and its people will know and experience the peace of God during the difficult and challenging socio-economic situation and low economic situation in especially Malawi, Zambia and Zimbabwe. Let us pray for peaceful social and political relations between various ethnic groups and peoples in the countries of the province for the betterment of the nations and her people.

WEEK 4

A Prayer for Love

But you, Lord, are a compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness. – Psalm 86.15

In the fourth week of the month, let us join together to pray for endearing love among the various sections and people of the various dioceses and nations of the province. Let us pray for love among people of differing faith, tribe, and political and economic affiliations in the constituent parishes, dioceses and countries of the province. Let us pray that all people will bear the burden of loving another and experience same in their personal and communal lives even as they undertake their various missions and ministries. Let us pray that the actions and thoughts of leaders and members of the church and communities will be directed by love for one another regardless of gender, ethnicity, creed, and nationality; that the mission of the church will be motivated and undergirded by genuine love for all people of faith and none, acknowledging that all are created in the image and likeness of

our Sovereign God. Pray for all who are socially disconnected, lonely and without any social connection or support.

- We join the Diocese of Kajo Keji in the Episcopal Church of South Sudan to celebrate the welcome of the Bishop (the Church) back to their episcopal home after many years of operating in the diaspora following the return of peace to the diocesan jurisdiction of the church.
