# Daehan Seonggonghoe The Anglican Church of Korea

60th Anniversary of the Dioceses of Seoul and Daejeon: Please pray for the Diocese of Seoul and the Diocese of Daejeon as they celebrate their 60th anniversaries on 27 May.



The Diocese of Seoul was established on 27 May 1965, when the first Korean bishop of the Anglican Church of Korea, Bishop Paul Lee Cheon-Hwan, was enthroned. This marked the end of the missionary bishop era and the beginning of a self-governing Korean diocese. Today, Bishop Elijah Kim Jang-Hwan serves as the 7th diocesan bishop, leading the diocese in active mission and ministry.


The Diocese of Daejeon was also established in 1965 when the church was reorganized into two dioceses under Bishop Lee's leadership. Currently, Bishop Titus Kim Ho-Wook serves as the 8th bishop, continuing the diocese's vibrant mission. Please pray for the Thanksgiving Eucharists and commemorative events being held in both dioceses, that they may bring glory to God and unity to the Church.

Centenary of the Mothers' Union in Korea: Please pray for the Centenary Planning Committee of the Mothers' Union of the Anglican Church of Korea. Pray that the leadership and members will be guided by God's grace and love as they prepare for the Thanksgiving Eucharist and the publication of the 100-Year History of the Mothers' Union, both scheduled for September. May this centenary be a time to give thanks for God's faithful guidance over the past 100 years, and may it be a celebration that give glory to God and strengthens the unity of the Church.

### The Anglican Church of Melanesia

- Give thanks for Religious orders who conducted missions during Holy Week in various parishes.
- ♣ Pray for effective Safeguarding Program roll outs.

## The Church of the Province of Myanmar

- **Earthquake Relief:** Pray for all those affected by the recent earthquake. May God comfort those who mourn loved ones. Pray for an effective rehabilitation process in the country.
- Cessation of Civil War: Pray for an end to the civil war in Myanmar and the establishment of genuine, lasting peace and reconciliation throughout the country.
- Support for Affected Dioceses: Of our nine dioceses, eight are located in war zones. Pray for the displaced individuals and refugees in these areas, including our church members.
- **Church Resilience:** The ongoing civil war has severely impacted the church in



Myanmar—socially, economically, financially, psychologically, and spiritually. Pray for strength and resilience during these challenging times.

- ♣ Protection for Youth: Many young people are attempting to evade conscription laws by fleeing to neighboring countries, often without proper documentation. Pray for their safety and for their parents, who are experiencing immense distress.
- ♣ Archbishop's Safety: Pray for the Archbishop, who leads the Christian Peace Supporting Committee and faces threats to his life.
- Construction Projects: CPM has to build a church, an Anglican Peace Center, and a parsonage on government-donated land. These projects are to be completed within four to five years, despite lacking firm financial security. Pray for the necessary resources and support.

♣ Christian Unity: Pray for all Christian churches in Myanmar to unite in Christ.

### The Episcopal Church in the Philippines

- ♣ Pray for Bishop-elect Richard Stone B Banagui as he prepares to be ordained and consecrated as the Bishop of North Central Philippines on May 1, and especially that he may faithfully proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom by representing Christ and his Church; guarding the faith, unity, and discipline of the whole Church; proclaiming the Word of God; acting in Christ's name for the reconciliation of the world and the building up of the Church; and ordaining others to continue Christ's ministry.
- Give thanks for the approval of the first trial use Book of Common Prayer in the Filipino language and for the hard work of the Episcopal Diocese of Central Philippines Committee on Liturgy. Pray that this initiative will contribute to bearing fruit in teaching, baptising and nurturing new believers.
- Give thanks for the close relationship between The Episcopal Church in the Philippines (ECP) and The Church of the Province of Myanmar (CPM), and for the willingness of the people of the ECP to give generously to the CPM's Myanmar Earthquake Response Initiative. Pray that this contribution will serve as a beacon of hope and compassion for those in desperate need.
- Pray with The National Council of Churches in the Philippines (NCCP) that the arrest of former President Rodrigo Roa Duterte shall be guided by the principle of due process and that this will serve as an inspiration for all, and that truth and justice will prevail in the end.
- Give thanks for the planting of 210 seedlings during the Pacific Coast Deanery's join Lent retreat of the Brotherhood of St Andrew (BSA), Episcopal Church Women (ECW), and SKEP youth organization in the Episcopal Diocese of Santiago. Pray that these seedlings will become mature trees and contribute to safeguarding the integrity of creation, and sustaining and renewing the life of the earth.

# The Council of Anglican Provinces of Africa Prayer Focus this month: The Church of the Province of Central Africa

#### WEEK 1

#### A Prayer for the Leadership of the Church and the Nations

Pay careful attention to yourselves and to all the flock, in which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to care for the church of God, which he obtained with his own blood.

- Acts 20.28

We come into the fifth month of the year with grateful hearts and lift up prayers to God as we bring before Him the Church of the Province of Central Africa under the Most Rev Albert Chama. We remember and pray for the College of Bishops, Clergy and Lay Leaders who (together with the Primate) provide both spiritual and temporal leadership to the members of the Church and their communities in the constituent countries of the province (Botswana, Malawi, Zambia, and Zimbabwe). We remember in our prayers the national leadership in the constituent countries and in all the other places where the ministry of the Church is shared. We pray for unity and single-mindedness among the ministers (both the ordained and lay) and also among the political, social and tribal leaders who, together with the church, work towards the well-being of the people, their prosperity and the peace of the nations. Join us to pray that the leaders (both spiritual and temporal) will be guided by wisdom to provide accountable leadership and stewardship and be enlightened by the Holy Spirit in their pursuit for justice, peace, and respect for each other in their various faith and tribal communities.

#### WEEK 2

#### A Prayer for Mercy, Healing and Fruitfulness

He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God.

— Micah 6.8

In the second week of May, we pray for fruitfulness, good health, and mercy for God's people in the Church of the Province of Central Africa and its constituent countries. We pray for the constituent dioceses of the province and the countries of the province that their peoples will increase and multiply in all their undertakings and be healed of all their infirmities and diseases. We pray for God's mercy and healing of the trauma suffered by the many families and communities affected by the human and natural disasters, especially

in Malawi, and for those affected by the mining spillage in the Copperbelt of Zambia. Let us pray for political and economic stability in the countries of the province. Join us to pray for the safety of women, young girls, children, and the elderly who are adversely impacted by challenges caused by the impacts of climate change and other challenges. Join us to pray for the various health and humanitarian ministries of the Church and for all those whose work and ministries bring healing and restoration to the sick, the traumatized and those challenged emotionally and psychologically within the dioceses of the province and their communities.

#### WEEK 3

#### **A Prayer for Peace**

Now may the Lord of peace himself give you peace at all times in every way. The Lord be with you all.

- 2 Thessalonians 3.16

In the third week of the month, we invite you to join us to pray for the peace of the Church and the countries that make up the province. We pray for the peaceful coexistence of the various political, tribal, and faith groups in the countries and their neighbours. We pray for all whose efforts and actions engender peace among the people and faith groups and pray for God's peace to undergird the ministries and mission of the Church and in the nation and for the pursuit of justice and godly actions in governance, commerce and trade, education and life-molding actions and within the various institutions of the nation and the Church. We pray that the countries of the province and their neighbours will know and experience the peace of Christ in their challenging political and socio-economic circumstances. We pray for peaceful social and political relations between the various ethnic groups and peoples, as well as political parties and faith groups, in the countries and for the betterment of the nation and its people.

#### WEEK 4

#### **A Prayer for Love**

And above all these, put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony.

- Colossians 3.14

In the fourth week of May, we join together to pray for enduring love among the various tribes, communities, and the members of the dioceses of the Province of Central Africa and in the constituent countries. Join us to pray for love among people of differing faiths, tribes, and political and economic affiliations in the constituent dioceses and countries of the province of Central Africa. We pray that all people of faith and none will bear the burden of loving one another and experience the same in their personal and communal lives even as they undertake their various missions and ministries in love and in service to each other. We pray that policies, programmes, actions and thoughts of leaders and members of the church and other faith communities, as well as those of the political

leadership, will be directed and motivated by love for one another regardless of gender, ethnicity, creed, and nationality; that the mission of the church will be motivated and undergirded by genuine love for all people of faith and none, acknowledging that all are created in the image and likeness of our Sovereign Lord. Pray for all who are socially disconnected, lonely and without any social connection or support.

#### Thanksgiving and Celebration

- - We join the leadership of the ZambiaAnglicanCouncil (ZAC) and the Zambia Anglican Council Outreach Programme (ZACOP) for their efforts to raise awareness and promote the rights and equality of women in the Church's ministries and to mainstream the same across the communities where the ministries of the Church are shared. We join ZAC and ZACOP to thank God for the success of their marking of the 2025 International Women's Day.
- Anglican Diocese of Northern Zambia
  - We give thanks to God for the ministry of the Diocese of Northern Zambia under the leadership of the Rt Rev John Kafwanka who led members of the Cathedral Church of St Michael and All Angels to undertake the patching of the road passing in front of the Cathedral. This was part of the Social Responsibility of the Cathedral Parish of Michael and All Angels. Well done, members and leaders of the Cathedral Parish in Kitwe.

Anglican Church of Ghana – St Nicholas' Seminary

The National Council of the Guild of the Good Shepherd - Anglican Church of Ghana has donated assorted items to St Nicholas' Seminary as part of the Guild's support to the training institution. The items included bags of rice, gallons of cooking oil, canned tomato paste, flour, and margarine, amongst others. Making the presentation at a brief ceremony in Cape Coast, Sister Emma Evangelina Yemoley, National Master Shepherd of the Guild, said the donation was an act of Christian charity, meant to support the upkeep of the seminarians and to enhance their welfare on campus. Receiving the items on behalf of the Seminary, the Very Reverend JusticeBain-Duodu, Dean of the Seminary, expressed his heartfelt gratitude to the Guild. He indicated that it was appropriate for Christians to demonstrate thel ove of Christ, and

commended various guilds and individual parishioners for their diverse contributions

to the Seminary.

- Wonderful news from the Diocese of Nampula (northern Mozambique, a Diocese of IAMA) in celebration of the well-earned award of an Honorary Doctorate degree in Humanities to Bishop Manuel Ernesto on 20 March 2025. The event was held in Lilongwe, Malawi and was attended by other fellow graduates from South Africa, Zambia, Zimbabwe, Mozambique and Malawi. It was in recognition of the practice of reconciliation through the Interfaith Peacebuilding Ministry at peace clubs. Bishop Manuel has written a paper on 'Church and Theology in the Context of Forced Migration'. To God and His work in the Community be the Glory!
- Commission on Theological Education in the Anglican Communion CTEAC +‡+ Join us to celebrate the appointment of the Rt Rev Victor Reginald Atta-Baffoe, Bishop of the Anglican Diocese of Cape Coast in Ghana (Church of the Province of West Africa) who has been appointed to Chair the Commission on Theological Education in the Anglican Communion (CTEAC). He takes over the chairmanship from Archbishop Gregory Howard, former Bishop of the Diocese of Jamica and the Caryman Isalnds and the Primate of the West Indies, who has since retired. In his acceptance remarks to the meeting of the Commission on 19 March, Bishop Victor said, "Theological education is not just about imparting knowledge. It is about shaping how we think, pray, and relate to one another. CTEAC can help Anglicans understand one another more deeply and engage with both commonalities and differences in faith." Prior to being elected as the Diocesan Bishop, Bishop Victor, was the Dean of St Nicholas' Seminary and the Canon Theologian of the Diocese of Cape Coast. He is currently the lead Bisho of Theological Education in the Church of the Province of West Afrca. CTEAC supports theological education across the Anglican Communion, strengthening networks and developing resources.
- Theological Education in the Province of Central Africa

  We invite you to join us to give thanks for the gathering of the Deans and other

leaders of theological education institutions in the Province of Central Africa who met in Blantyre last month to give thought and develop strategy on how to improve and grow theological education in the province. The institutions involved are Leonard Kamungu Theological College and Lake Malawi University (both in Malawi), St John's Seminary (Zambia), Bishop Gaul Theological College (Zimbabwe) and St Augustine's Theological College (Botswana).

We join the Bishop and the members of the Diocese of Southern Malawi to give thanks to God for the success of their Diocesan celebration of the Feast of the Annunciation (March 25) which they call Mary's Day. Addressing the members, the Diocesan Bishop, the Rt Rev Alenafe Kalemba encouraged the members to follow the example of Mary, who had profound faith and was obedient to God's call to participate in the salvation of humankind. He emphasized that God does the impossible to bring change and salvation. He further called the faithful not to be intimidated or allow themselves to be used or manipulated by the politicians who make a lot of promises but never deliver. This is ahead of the country's General Elections in September. He advised against the instigation of violence and instead called on al IMalawians to be vigilant. Join us to pray for peaceful election campaigns before, during, and after the the process.

#### 

The Archbishop of the Anglican Church of Kenya has placed a "pulpit gag" on all politicians in all Anglican Church in Kenya. Speaking at the consecration and enthronement service of the Bishops of Nairobi and Mount Kenya West (see below), the Archbishop directed that no politician (including the President) will be allowed to address the members in any Anglican Church space during the service. He indicated that the politicians can address the members after the service.

We join the Archbishop and the leadership of the Anglican Church of Kenya to give thanks to God and celebrate the successful election, consecration, and enthronement of the Rt Rev Jonathan Kabiru Kariuki as Bishop of Nairobi Diocese and the Rt Rev Gerald Mwangi Murithi as the Bishop of the Diocese of Mount Kenya West. Join us to pray for our dear Brothers and Fathers in God as they provide leadership for God's children in the two dioceses. Let us also pray for the processes towards the filling of the episcopal vacancies in the Dioceses of Machakos and Garissa, all of the Anglican Church in Kenya.

 The Anglican Diocese of Botswana is set to admit the first batch of fourteen (14)

women as deacons in the province. The ordination service, slated for 4 May 2025 will be historic as the Church of the Province of Central Africa has never admitted women into Holy Orders. A resolution of the 2023 Provincial Synod on the admission of women into the ordained ministry paved the way for Botswana to be the first to ordain women. These women have had various levels of training and preparation through St Augustine's Theological College. Please pray for the bishop, the clergy and particularly for the ordinands as they prepare for, and begin their ministerial journey.
