Who are ABM's Partners?

- Pray for justice for Layan Nasir and Shadeh Khoury who face many months of military detention on false charges.
- ♣ Pray for a speedy end to the war and a rapid movement towards a just and lasting peace in the Holy Land, under an equitable Two-State solution.

- Seoul Cathedral "Community Day": On 19 October, Seoul Cathedral will hold an outdoor Community Day for all members of the congregation. Please pray that many will join in offering thanksgiving through the Eucharist and sharing fellowship in Christ with one heart and mind. Pray especially that those who have not participated actively in church life may take this opportunity to reconnect with the church community.

The Episcopal Church of the Philippines

Give thanks for the successful Brotherhood of St. Andrew District Assembly in the Episcopal Diocese of Central Philippines, and pray that their unity in faith and service will continue to bear fruit for the growth of the brotherhood and the expansion of God's kingdom.



Give thanks for the successful opening of the first academic year of the Graduate Theological Union of the Philippines at the ECP's Saint Andrew's Theological Seminary, and pray for its pioneer faculty and first batch of students.

WEEK 1

A Prayer for the Leadership of the Church and the Nations

It shall not be so among you. But whoever would be great among you must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be your slave, even as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.

- Matthew 20.26-28

Welcome to the month of October, the tenth month of the year. In this month, we kindly invite you to join us in giving thanks to God for bringing us this far in the year, even as we pray for the Episcopal Churches of Sudan and South Sudan under the primacy of the Most Rev. Ezekiel Kondo and Most Rev. Dr. Justin Badi Arama of Sudan and South Sudan respectively. Join us to remember and pray for the College of Bishops, Clergy and lay leaders who (together with the Primates) provide both spiritual and temporal leadership to the members of the Churches and their communities in Sudan and South Sudan. We remember in our prayers the national and political leaders and all those to whom leadership responsibilities have been entrusted. We pray for unity and singlemindedness among the ministers (both the ordained and lay) and also among the political, social and tribal leaders who, together with the church, work towards the well-being of the people, their prosperity and the peace of the nations. Join us to pray for wisdom, accountable leadership, and stewardship, and that, enlightened by the Holy Spirit, all leaders in Sudan and South Sudan may work towards the pursuit of justice, peace, and respect for one another in their various faith and tribal communities."

WEEK 2

A Prayer for Mercy, Healing and Fruitfulness

Then they cried to the LORD in their trouble, and he saved them from their distress. He sent out his word and healed them; he rescued them from the grave. Let them give thanks to the LORD for his unfailing love and his wonderful deeds for mankind.

- Psalm 107.19-21

In the second week of the month of October, join us to pray for fruitfulness, good health, and the mercies of God for the people of Sudan and South Sudan and in all the place where

the ministries of the Church reach. We pray that the people will increase and multiply in all their undertakings and be healed of all their infirmities and diseases. We pray for God's mercy and healing of the trauma suffered by the many families and communities affected by conflicts and war, tribal infractions, and economic and political challenges in Sudan and South Sudan and for those devastated by continued fighting between various groups in the Dafur region of Sudan and the political standoff between the President and his Vice and their groups in South Sudan. We pray for political and economic stability in Sudan and South Sudan and for the safety of women, youth, children, and the elderly who are adversely impacted by the challenges caused by the effects of the conflicts, political and economic difficulties exacerbated by the activities of armed bandits and other issues. Join us to pray for the various health and humanitarian ministries of the Church and for all those whose work and ministries bring healing and restoration to the sick, the traumatized and those challenged emotionally and psychologically within the dioceses of the provinces of Sudan and South Sudan and their communities.

WEEK 3

A Prayer for Peace

You will keep in perfect peace those whose mind is steadfast, because they trust in you.

- Isaiah 26.3

In the third week of October, we invite you to join us in praying for peace in the provinces, dioceses, and communities that make up the countries of Sudan and South Sudan. We pray for the peaceful coexistence of the various political, tribal, and faith groups in the two countries and for all whose efforts and actions engender peace among the people and faith groups. We pray that God's peace would undergird the ministries and mission of the Church and the nations, especially those mediating for peace and for the pursuit of justice and godly actions in governance, commerce and trade, education, and life-molding actions within the various institutions of the nation and the Church. We pray that the nations of Sudan and South Sudan and the Churches will know and experience the peace of Christ in their political and socio-economic circumstances, and for peaceful social and political relations between the various ethnic groups and peoples, as well as political parties and faith groups, for the betterment of the nations and their peoples.

WEEK 4

A Prayer for Love

Love is patient; love is kind. It does not envy; it does not boast; it is not proud. It is not rude; it is not self-seeking; it is not easily angered; it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.

— 1 Corinthians 13.4-7

In the fourth week of the month, we come together to pray for enduring love among the various tribes, communities, and the members of the dioceses of the Episcopal Churches of Sudan and South Sudan. We pray for love among people of differing faith, tribes, and political and economic affiliations in the constituent dioceses and countries of Sudan and South Sudan, that all people of faith and none will bear the burden of loving one another and experience the same in their personal and communal lives, even as they undertake their various missions and ministries in love and in service to each other. We pray that policies, programmes, actions, and thoughts of leaders and members of the church and other faith communities, as well as those of the political leadership, will be directed and motivated by love for one another regardless of gender, ethnicity, creed, and nationality; that the mission of the church will be motivated and undergirded by genuine love for all people of faith and none, acknowledging that all are created in the image and likeness of our Sovereign Lord. Pray for all who are socially disconnected, lonely and without any social connection or support.

- Anglican Diocese of Seychelles

 Join us to thank God for the successful election, episcopal ordination, consecration, and enthronement of the Rt Rev Danny Rollan Henry Elizabeth as the new Bishop of the Diocese of Seychelles, succeeding the Most Rev. Dr. James Wang, who retired last year. Prior to his election to the episcopal office, Bishop Elizabeth trained as a teacher and taught Mathematics in primary and secondary schools in Seycehlles before entering ordained ministry. He was ordained a deacon on 12th December 1999 and a priest on 3rd December 2000 by the late Archbishop Emeritus French Chang-Him. On the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, in 2012 he was appointed Archdeacon of the Diocese of Seychelles. Join us to pray for him as he starts his episcopal ministry, and let us pray for the Diocese of Seychelles that Jesus' saying, I came that they may have life and have it abundantly (John 10:10) may find visible expression in the life of the diocese and in the nation of Seychelles under his leadership.

Bishop Charles May of the Diocese of Highveld preached and presided over the Holy Eucharist Service on behalf of the Metropolitan of the Anglican Church of Southern Africa, The Most Rev Dr Archbishop Thabo Makgoba. Join us to pray for the continued flourishing of the Compact agreement and mission between the Anglican Church of Sothern Africa and the Episcopal Church of Ethiopia as a model of mission cooperation between Africa Anglican provinces and churches. - The Anglican Church of Southern Africa Diocese of Namibia
 We join the Anglican Diocese of Namibia to give thanks to God as they celebrate the centenary of mission in the country. The diocese covers the entire country of Namibia. It originated at the turn of the 20th century when clergy from the Diocese Cape Town visited the then South West Africa to minister mainly to the white expatriates, particularly of British descent, who were working in towns such as Walvisbay, Luderitz, Keetmashoop and Windhoek. It was from thosehumble beginnings that the Diocese of Damaraland, as it was formally known, was born, with Nelson Fogarty, a former Army Chaplain of the Union Forces of South Africa as its first bishop. The missionary work in Ovamboland was headed by Reverend (later Bishop) George Wolfe Robert Tobias, locally known as Tate Lukenge. The Diocese of Damaraland was later renamed to Diocese of Namibia as the country was also later known. The name Namibia comes from the name Namib, which is derived from the centuries-old Namib Desert. The

100th Anniversary celebration and sermon was graced by the Primate of the Anglican Church of Southern Africa, the Most Rev Dr Thabo Magkoba. We wish the Diocese well in the mission and ministry going forward.

In Memoriam

Anglican Church of Ghana

We join the Anglican Church of Ghana and the entire Ghanaian community to continue to pray for the repose of the souls of the eight (8) persons (including two ministers of state) who perished in a helicopter accident as they were visiting illegal mining sites in the Ashanti region of Ghana in August. Postage stamp from Germany. In 1219, during the Fifth Crusade, St. Francis of Assisi journeyed to Damietta, Egypt, and met with Sultan al-Malik al-Kamil of Egypt, Palestine, and Syria. Francis, accompanied by Brother Illuminato who knew Arabic, sought to preach Christianity to the Sultan. The Sultan, who was impressed by Francis's sincerity and courage, allowed him to preach in his court but did not convert. The encounter ultimately fostered mutual respect, with the Sultan showing leniency toward Christian prisoners after the meeting.
