Who are ABM's Partners?

May all the preparations and plans be fulfilled according to God's will, and may each person take responsibility in their given tasks. Above all, may the whole celebration bring glory to God. On this day, a thanksgiving Eucharist will be held, together with the blessing of the commemorative book "100 Years of the Mothers' Union in the Anglican Church of Korea." Please pray that those who attend may come

- to recognize how God has guided and sustained the Mothers' Union with love and grace throughout the past century, lifting them up in times of trial and hardship.
- ♣ 29 September 135th Anniversary of the Anglican Church of Korea: 29 September marks the 135th anniversary of the founding of the Anglican Church of Korea. On All Saints' Day, 1 November 1889, Archbishop Benson of Canterbury consecrated Charles John Corfe as the first Bishop of Korea at Westminster Abbey. Bishop Corfe (known in Korea as Bishop Ko Yo-han) arrived in Jemulpo (Incheon) on 29 September 1890. We give thanks for the 135 years during which God has established the Anglican Church in this land, expanded the kingdom of God, and united us with the worldwide Anglican Communion. Please pray that the Church in Korea may now respond to this grace by going forward as a renewed missionary church, proclaiming the gospel of Christ to the world. Pray also that the Spirit of reconciliation may be poured upon us so that we may serve as a bridge in the ecumenical and interdenominational movement for unity.

The Anglican Church of Melanesia

- Pray for the Community of the Sisters of Melanesia. They will be having their festivity on the 27th of September. They will admit new Novices and some will be released from their vows.
