With the Psalmist let us pray, 'Let my prayer be counted as incense before you, Lord, and the lifting up of my hands as an evening sacrifice' (141.2).



Who are ABM's Overseas Partners?

HIS MONTH WE ARE ASKING YOU not only to remember our each of our Australian dioceses as they grapple with the Covid-19 pandemic, but also each of our each of our Overseas Partners as they deal with it too. Our Overseas Partners consist of Activity Partners (with whom we currently have joint activities), Relational Partners (with whom we have historical relationships) and Networking Partners (with whom we work overseas, or with whom we share information). We have, as the well-used Anglican phrase describes it, strong *bonds of affection* for all of them. Because our overseas work involves both the Church, through our Church-to-Church Unit, and communities, though our Anglicans in Development Unit, we often relate to our partners both through the Church itself and through a particular Church's community development arm. Information from our Partners regarding Covid-19 will be put up on our website as it comes to hand.

EACH DAY THIS MONTH

- ✤ From Easter onwards: Alleluia to our Father, praise and thanksgiving for life and life eternal. Alleluia to our Lord Jesus Christ, the gateway to life everlasting and the conqueror of death and hell. Alleluia to the Holy Spirit Who guides us through our earthly life. Alleluia to our triune God.
- Pray for: for all those who have been affected by natural disasters in Australia, especially those without permanent homes; for the 4000+ Ukrainian asylum seekers in Australia, here as a result of the Russian invasion; for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians who represent 3% of the population but who are overrepresented at 29% of the adult prison population. Pray that the systemic issues that cause this may be addressed; for children's rights in Australia that the minimum age of criminal responsibility be raised from 10 to 14, the internationally-accepted age; for Indigenous children who are 20 time more likely to be incarcerated than their non-Indigenous peers; that Australia will endorse the Safe Schools Declaration, an intergovernmental pledge now supported by 112 countries to protect education in times of conflict.
- Give thanks for the medical staff who have been working so tirelessly during the pandemic; for the development of vaccines; for the way in which people have been flexible and managed to cope despite the difficulties; for all those who have shown kindness to their neighbours throughout the course of the pandemic so far; for Australia's low unemployment rate; for the Federal Government's commitment to end violence against women and children within a generation; for the recent establishment of the national anti-corruption commission; for all those who volunteer in organisations to help Australia to become a better place.
- ✤ From Easter onwards: Lord God, we thank You for the precious gift of new life, may we never take it for granted, but live each moment in the fullness of life that Jesus has gained for us.

Prayer Points from our *Overseas Partners*~



The Anglican Church in Aotearoa, **New Zealand and Polynesia**

Please pray for families and communities that have lost loved ones and had houses and livelihoods destroyed as a result of Cyclone Gabrielle which devastated parts of the North Island last month. Waiapu Diocese and Te Pihopatanga o Te Tairawhiti have been particularly impacted.

We give thanks for the courage, skill and generosity of the first +++

responders including the staff from the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) and churches and marae that responded immediately.

- Pray for clergy in the affected areas who are not only dealing with the loss of buildings + and significant damage but are also providing pastoral support to grieving communities.
- Pray especially for Archbishop Don Tamihere, Te Pihopa (Bishop) o Te Tairawhiti and + Te Pihopa o Aotearoa, who oversees Te Pihopatanga o Aotearoa (the five Hui Amorangi for the Maori Anglican Church). He will be leading Tikanga Maori through some heartbreaking and difficult times ahead especially given the loss of and damage to taonga, or cultural treasures.
- Thank you for the generosity of people who have already donated money, time and + much-needed items to the Cyclone Gabrielle Emergency Appeal launched by Anglican Missions on behalf of the Church.
- Pray for the Most Rev Sione Uluilakepa as he begins his episcopal ministry as + Archbishop of Polynesia

The Church of the Province of Myanmar


- Pray for the Anglican Training and Resource Centre building as we are working on the paper works to get the legal permit to use this building by June 2023.

- We pray for a lasting and peaceful resolution of the continuing territorial dispute between the Philippines and China over the West Philippine Sea.




The Episcopal Church of South Sudan



WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS IN THE AMERICAS. No country has reported increases in new cases of 20% or greater compared to the previous 28-day period. Large raw numbers of new cases have been reported recently by the United States of America, Brazil and Mexico.

WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS AROUND THE EASTERN MEDITERRANEAN. Large proportional increases in Covid case numbers have recently been seen in Kuwait, Iran and Pakistan. Large raw numbers of new cases have been reported recently by Iran, the United Arab Emirtes and Lebanon.

Let all who take refuge in you rejoice, O Lord: Let them ever sing for joy.

WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS IN EUROPE. Large proportional increases in Covid case numbers have recently been seen in Kyrgyzstan, Poland and Armenia. Large raw numbers of new cases have been reported recently by Russia, Germany and Austria.

Let all who take refuge in you rejoice, O Lord: Let them ever sing for joy.

WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS IN SOUTH-EAST ASIA. Large proportional increases in Covid case numbers have recently been seen in India and the Maldives. Large raw numbers of new cases have been reported recently by India, Indonesia and Thailand.

Let all who take refuge in you rejoice, O Lord: Let them ever sing for joy.

AND WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS IN OUR OWN REGION, THE WESTERN PACIFIC. A large proportional increase in Covid case numbers has recently been seen in Nauru, Singapore and the Marshall Islands. Large raw numbers of new cases have been reported recently by Japan, China and South Korea.

Let all who take refuge in you rejoice, O Lord: Let them ever sing for joy.

* Statistics are the latest available from the WHO and are accurate as of 16 March 2023. Infection rates are now decreasing in most parts of the world., however, there is concern over new variants and over the effects of long covid. Death rates are continuing to fall in most parts of the world.
