Included in this edition of Partners Praying Together are the prayer points that we have received. We have included these so that you can show prayerful concern for them as they, who like us are 'wearied by the changes and chances of this fleeting world' (as the prayer from Compline puts it), adjust to living in a time of global pandemic. You'll also find the usual things we would normally have: the feasts and commemorations from the lectionary, the Australian Cycle of Prayer, and commemorations from the United Nations calendar. All the material is designed to inform your prayers for our Overseas Partners, the bishops and dioceses of our Church and for wider global concerns. With the Psalmist let us pray, 'Let my prayer be counted as incense before you, Lord, and the lifting up of my hands as an evening sacrifice' (141.2).

Who are ABM's Overseas Partners?

HIS MONTH WE ARE ASKING YOU not only to remember our each of our Australian dioceses as they grapple with the Covid-19 pandemic, but also each of our each of our Overseas Partners as they deal with it too. Our Overseas Partners consist of Activity Partners (with whom we currently have joint activities), Relational Partners (with whom we have historical relationships) and Networking Partners (with whom we work overseas, or with whom we share information). We have, as the well-used Anglican phrase describes it, strong *bonds of affection* for all of them. Because our overseas work involves both the Church, through our Church-to-Church Unit, and communities, though our Anglicans in Development Unit, we often relate to our partners both through the Church itself and through a particular Church's community development arm. EACH DAY THIS MONTH

- Father, guide us so that we may walk in Your way, rejoice in Your truth and be kept for ever in the life which You give, which is eternal; through Him Who lived and died and rose again for us, Jesus Christ our Saviour.
- Pray for: for all those who have been affected by natural disasters in Australia, especially those still without permanent homes and those whose businesses have been badly affected; for the 4000+ Ukrainian asylum seekers in Australia, here as a result of the Russian invasion; for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians who represent 3% of the population but who are overrepresented at 29% of the adult prison population. Pray that the systemic issues that cause this may be addressed; for children's rights in Australia that the minimum age of criminal responsibility be raised from 10 to 14, the internationally-accepted age; for Indigenous children who are 20 time more likely to be incarcerated than their non-Indigenous peers; that Australia will endorse the Safe Schools Declaration, an intergovernmental pledge now supported by 112 countries to protect education in times of conflict.
- Give thanks for the medical staff who have been working so tirelessly during the pandemic; for the development of vaccines; for the way in which people have been flexible and managed to cope despite the difficulties; for all those who have shown kindness to their neighbours throughout the course of the pandemic so far; for Australia's low unemployment rate; for the Federal Government's commitment to end violence against women and children within a generation; for the recent establishment of the national anti-corruption commission; for all those who volunteer in organisations to help Australia to become a better place.
- Father, we thank You for showing us the Way, in human terms that we find easier to understand.

The Anglican Church in Aotearoa, New Zealand and Polynesia

- Please continue to pray for communities impacted by Cyclone Gabrielle and for the role that the Anglican Church has in recovery efforts. Thank you for the way so many parishes and individuals are supporting those in need.
- We give thanks for the generosity of parishes, agencies and individuals in raising over \$365,000 for the Anglican Missions Cyclone Gabrielle Appeal. We pray for guidance for the small working group appointed to make decisions on the allocation of those funds.
- We give thanks for the vision of Henry and William Williams who came to Aotearoa NZ in 1823 and 1826 (respectively) and their commitment to the Treaty of Waitangi, land, Māori education and translating the Bible. The bicentenary of their arrival has just been celebrated. Give thanks for the generosity of family trusts that continues to support mission in Aotearoa and the Pacific.
- As we approach winter, we pray for the homeless and for families struggling to make ends meet. Thank you for church agencies committed to supporting those in our communities who are most in need.

The Anglican Church of The Church of the Province of Myanmar


- ♣ Pray for the Anglican Training and Resource Centre building as we are working on the paper works to get the legal permit to use this building by June 2023.


- 4 As the country marks Constitution Memorial Day, pray that Japan may continue to preserve and work to uphold the current peace constitution



WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS IN SOUTH-EAST ASIA. Large proportional increases in Covid case numbers have recently been seen in Napal, India and the Maldives. Large raw numbers of new cases have been reported recently by India, Indonesia and Thailand.

Let all who take refuge in you rejoice, O Lord:

Let them ever sing for joy.

AND WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS IN OUR OWN REGION, THE WESTERN PACIFIC. A large proportional increase in Covid case numbers has recently been seen in Samoa, the Marshall Islands and American Samoa. Large raw numbers of new cases have been reported recently by Japan, China and Australia.
