You'll also find the usual things we would normally have: the feasts and commemorations from the lectionary, the Australian Cycle of Prayer, and commemorations from the United Nations calendar. All the material is designed to inform your prayers for our Overseas Partners, the bishops and dioceses of our Church and for wider global concerns. With the Psalmist let us pray, 'Let my prayer be counted as incense before you, Lord, and the lifting up of my hands as an evening sacrifice' (141.2).

Who are ABM's Overseas Partners?

HIS MONTH WE ARE ASKING YOU not only to remember our each of our Australian dioceses as they grapple with the Covid-19 pandemic, but also each of our each of our Overseas Partners as they deal with it too. Our Overseas Partners consist of Activity Partners (with whom we currently have joint activities), Relational Partners (with whom we have historical relationships) and Networking Partners (with whom we work overseas, or with whom we share information). EACH DAY THIS MONTH

- Blessed Trinity, Eternal Unity, we pray that we find inspiration in Your bonds of love. May all our relationships with others be life-giving and grounded in love.
- ♣ Pray for: for all those who have been affected by natural disasters in Australia, especially those still without permanent homes and those whose businesses have been badly affected; for the 4000+ Ukrainian asylum seekers in Australia, here as a result of the Russian invasion; for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians who represent 3% of the population but who are overrepresented at 29% of the adult prison population. Pray that the systemic issues that cause this may be addressed; for children's rights in Australia that the minimum age of criminal responsibility be raised from 10 to 14, the internationally-accepted age; for Indigenous children who are 20 time more likely to be incarcerated than their non-Indigenous peers; that Australia will endorse the Safe Schools Declaration, an intergovernmental pledge now supported by 112 countries to protect education in times of conflict.
- Give thanks for the medical staff who have been working so tirelessly during the pandemic; for the development of vaccines; for the way in which people have been flexible and managed to cope despite the difficulties; for all those who have shown kindness to their neighbours throughout the course of the pandemic so far; for Australia's low unemployment rate; for the Federal Government's commitment to end violence against women and children within a generation; for the recent establishment of the national anti-corruption commission; for all those who volunteer in organisations to help Australia to become a better place.
- God of the universe, we thank You for revealing Yourself to us as Father, Son and Spirit. May we always follow Your way of self-giving love.

Prayer Points from our Overseas Partners



The Anglican Church in Aotearoa, New Zealand and Polynesia

- Pray for the families of those who recently lost loved ones in the recent fatal fire at a boarding hostel in Wellington. Pray for the residents who managed to escape - many of whom are vulnerable and struggling.
- Give thanks for the response agencies that acted so swiftly, for the Wellington City Mission and for the generosity of strangers. We pray that as a nation, ways can be found to better support those who are forced to live on the margins of society.
- Give thanks for the meeting of the Oceania Regional Advisory Committee (ORAC) in Honiara and for the valuable work carried out by its members including the Anglican Board of Mission and Anglican Missions (NZ).
- ♣ Pray for those struggling because of Cyclone Gabrielle and give thanks for the funds being distributed by Hāpaitia, the group charged with coordinating the Anglican Church's response.



The Episcopal Church of Jerusalem and the Middle East

- For an end to acts of religious hatred against Christians in the Holy Land
- For Archbishop Hosam Naoum, newly installed as Primate of the Province
- For Bishop Michael Lewis, former Primate, preparing to retire after 24 years' ministry as a bishop
- For those in the Province deeply concerned with climate justice and with action for a cleaner, more equitable Middle East

For every Anglican congregation and church in the dioceses of the Province, especially those that are small and isolated.

The Episcopal Church in the Philippines

- We give thanks for ecumenical partnerships: for the stronger concordat relations between the Philippine Independent Church and the Episcopal Church in the Philippines. For the success of joint programs between these churches including pilgrimages and tree planting activities.
- Pray that the dreaded El Niño phenomenon forecasted in the coming months up to the first part of 2024 be reversed so that there will be enough rains for irrigation and to fill up the water tables for household consumption.



- Pray for the on-going liturgical consultations that these will result in meaningful innovations in the liturgical life of the Church.
- Pray for the planned re-framing of the mission of Episcopal schools that this will result in the operationalization of the Five Marks of Mission as the distinctive element of these schools.

Let all who take refuge in you rejoice, O Lord: Let them ever sing for joy.

AND WE PRAY FOR OUR SISTERS AND BROTHERS IN OUR OWN REGION, THE WESTERN PACIFIC. A large proportional increase in Covid case numbers has recently been seen in Vietnam, Mongolia and the Philippines. Large raw numbers of new cases have been reported recently by South Korea. Japan, and Australia.
