
The Anglican Church of Papua New Guinea

WEEK 1

Let us pray that as Mozambique prepares for national elections, all will stand to pledge to work for peace. We pray for a peaceful electoral process in the Diocese of the Good Shepherd in Angola as

they elect a bishop on 8 July 2023. Let us pray that various efforts to stem the continued insurgence in Cabo Delgado and other places where peace has been undermined will be successful and sustained and that lasting peace will reign.

WEEK 2

A Prayer for Mercy, Healing and Fruitfulness

... with the choicest gifts of the ancient mountains and the fruitfulness of the everlasting hills ... let these rest on the head of Joseph. – Deuteronomy 33.15-16

In the second week of this month, join us to stand in prayer that the Lord will show mercy, heal, and restore the nations of Mozambique and Angola. We remember in prayer the people and communities uprooted by the insurgence in Cabo Delgado in Mozambique and other places in Angola; pray for people and communities who have been uprooted and displaced and for those whose circumstance have made them lose their self-worth and sense of human dignity. Please intercede for health and social workers who administer health and healing to the sick, the traumatized and those challenged emotionally and psychologically.

WEEK 3

A Prayer for the Leadership of the Church and the Nations

Remember your leaders who spoke the word of God to you. Consider the outcome of their way of life and imitate their faith. – Hebrews 13.7

In the third week of the month, join us to celebrate the goodness and faithfulness of God as we pray for Igreja Anglicana de Moçambique e Angola (IAMA). Remember to pray for the Primate, the **Most Rev. Carlos Matsinhe** and the College of Bishops and other leaders of the church and the countries of Mozambique and Angola. Join us to pray for the political and community leaders that they will humbly acknowledge and accept the sovereignty of God over their nations and people.

WEEK 4

A Prayer for Love

Great is your love, reaching to the heavens; your faithfulness reaches to the skies. – Psalm 57.10

In the fourth week of the month, we invite you to join us to pray for people of all faith and none in the countries of Mozambique and Angola. Let us pray that all people in the two countries will experience the love of God as they carry on with their ministries and endeavours and pray that they will heed God's command to love and live in love with one another. Join us to pray that the actions and thoughts of the people in the two countries will be directed by love for one another despite differences of gender, ethnicity, creed, and

nationality. Let us pray that every ministry of the church will be motivated by genuine love for all people of faith and none, acknowledging that all are created in the image and likeness of our Sovereign God.

- ♣ On May 30 we successfully completed the six-week online Eco-Theology Course which witnessed a total of 345 registrants with an average of 85 participants each week. Thank you for your support and prayers towards the success of the programme. Join us to pray for the planning towards the regional courses that will help address the contextual peculiarities.
- → Join us to thank God for the success of the first of the capacity enhancement training for the leadership of the Meru Diocese of the Anglican Church of Kenya.
- Thank God for the life, ministry and now for the repose of the Most Rev (Emeritus)
 French Chang Him, former Primate of the Province of the Anglican Church of the
 Indian Ocean and first indigenous Bishop of the Diocese of Seychelles. His burial was
 on 9 June 2023, which would have marked his 60th Anniversary of ordination.

Prayer Requests from Various Provinces

Kenya

A new Financial Bill has been placed before parliament that will see increases in taxes and levies. This has raised a lot of concerns among various sections of the public. Pray that as the government, civil societies and the opposition parties state their positions on the bill, sound reasoning will prevail that will help avert the planned civic disobedience if the bill is passed by parliament in its present form.

Sudan

The fighting between the government forces and the Rapid Support Force still rages despite various calls for a ceasefire and the ongoing talks between the warring factions. Churches have become targets and their properties – Church buildings, vehicles and other property have been raided and looted. There is massive recruitment by both sides from the Arab communities in Darfur highlighting fears that the fighting could spread along ethnic and religious lines.

Mozambique

- Pray for IAMA as they prepare to host CAPA and Anglican Communion Office facilitated Bishops' and Spouses' Orientation from 22 July to 2 August 2023. Pray for God's provision of human, material, and financial resources towards the programme and that pray that the training may inspire, enable and strengthen bishops in their leadership roles.
- Pray for every Diocese of IAMA, for bishops, clergy, lay ministers, and people of every parish that God may grant them wisdom, spirit of unity and purpose, and commitment to building up their dioceses with the faith that He who called them will give them success. Pray for the restructuring of the provincial organizations such as the Mothers' Union, Bernard Mizeki Men's Guild, and Anglican Youth, among others.

Gambia

Give thanks for the Episcopal Ordination, Consecration and Enthronement of the Rev Fr St Obed Arist Kojo Baiden as the 8th Diocesan Bishop of the Anglican Diocese of The Gambia. Services occurred on 17 and 18 June 2023 in the Cathedral Church of St Mary, Banjul.

Madagascar

Give thanks for the Synod of the Anglican Church of the Indian Ocean which took place in Madagascar from 1 to 7 June 2023.
