


The Anglican Church of Kenya

WEEK 1

A Prayer for the Leadership of the Church and of the Nations

I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people— for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. This is good and pleases God our Saviour. -1 Timothy 2.1-2

Welcome to August, a month when we trust the Lord to give us rest on all sides and from every challenging context and situation. As we look to the Lord, join us to pray for the Anglican Church of Tanzania (ACT) that they may continue to know and experience the faithfulness of God in every aspect of their mission and ministry. Let us pray for the Primate, the Most Rev Dr Maimbo Mndolwa and the Bishops of the 28 Dioceses that make up the province. As we pray for the Church, we join our hearts to also pray for the political and religious leaders of the United Republic of Tanzania that in humility and diligence, they will acknowledge and accept the sovereignty of God over their nation, groups, and all people. Let us remember the over 2,500,000 members of the church in Tanzania. As we pray for ACT, we remember the various initiatives and activities of the Church, especially the ACT Strategic Planning conference that comes up at the end of the month. Pray also for the Diocesan Secretaries' conference scheduled for September 2023 and the meeting of the Provincial Standing Committee to be held in November 2023.

WEEK 2

A Prayer for Mercy, Healing and Fruitfulness

But blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose confidence is in him. They will be like a tree planted by the water that sends out its roots by the stream. It does not fear when heat comes; its leaves are always green. It has no worries in a year of drought and never fails to bear fruit. – Jeremiah 17:7-8

In the second week we stand in prayer that the Lord will show mercy, heal, and restore the peoples and communities of the United Republic of Tanzania. We remember in prayer the people and communities who have taken refuge in Tanzania from disturbances in Mozambique; for those trafficked from Ethiopia and other countries and abandoned in various parts of Tanzania and for the communities and people who host these vulnerable groups of people. We pray that the Lord will show mercy to the afflicted, healing for the wounded in body, mind and spirit and make host communities and families fruitful in their endeavours so they can support those in need. Let us pray for the various ministries of the Church that provide health and healing and for all whose work brings healing and restoration to the sick, the traumatized and those challenged emotionally and psychologically. We particularly invite you to join us to pray for Master Tahona Maimbo who is battling childhood cancer and is seeking treatment in Egypt. Pray especially for the parents in these trying moments.

WEEK 3

A Prayer for Peace

Great peace have those who love your law, and nothing can make them stumble. - Psalm 119:165

In the third week of the month, we stand in prayer for the peace of the nation of Tanzania and in the various troubled parts of the province. In particular, join us to pray for the Diocese of Zanzibar which has been in conflict for the last 4 years, and to give thanks to God for the restoration of peace in the Diocese of Lake Rukwa (Sumbawanga area) which had been in conflict for the last 13 years and are now celebrating peace. We pray that the God of peace will speak peace in the various places and context where peace is needed and for the fulfilment of the desire for peaceful living together of brothers and sisters (Psalm 133) so that they may enjoy the blessings of the Lord on all sides. Join us to pray for unity in the Church of Tanzania. Join us to pray for ACT's presence and participation in the various religious and ecumenical spaces in the country that they will model a true prophetic presence and voice in these spaces.

WEEK 4

A Prayer for Love

And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love. -1 Corinthians 13.13

In the fourth week of the month, we invite you to join us to pray for people of all faith and none in Tanzania, that love shall undergird all relations between the two dominant faith groups – Christians and Muslims. Join us to pray that all people in Tanzania will bear the burden of love and experience same in their personal and communal lives even as they undertake their various tasks and responsibilities. Let us pray that the actions and thoughts of all people in Tanzania will be directed by love for one another regardless of gender, ethnicity, creed, and nationality; that the ministries of the church will be motivated and undergirded by genuine love for all people of faith and none, acknowledging that all are created in the image and likeness of our Sovereign God.

The Democratic Republic of the Congo

- * "Our situation is a matter of life and death, but we have chosen to live," says Archbishop Ande Titre George, Primate of D.R. Congo. He recounts the impact of the conflict, activities of militia groups, the level of insecurity and the massive humanitarian need that confronts the country and for which the Church is called to respond. Over 1.6 million people have been displaced and live in over-stretch camps and communities, mass movement of people from the rural areas for fear of attacks with the net effect of low farm activities leading low productivity and resulting in high cost of living.
- With upcoming national elections, the church seeks to provide relevant electoral literacy and to encourage her members (the laity) to activity participate in the political life of the church. Trauma and healing (especially of the young people who have known nothing but war) is paramount in raising a generation that will not be scared by the effects of war.
- ✤ We covet your prayers for the various initiatives to support the prophetic role of the church and for strength and courage for the leadership of the church as they speak truth to power.
- Give thanks to God for the various relief support to the province from ABM AID,
 CMS Ireland, Anglican Alliance, Episcopal Relief and Development and many others who lend a hand to the work of the church and give relief to those in need.
