 Vacation Church School programs in local church communities through the dedication of their volunteer teachers and pray for increasing love for the Christian faith among our children and youth.


- Give thanks for the generous donors to the ECP Banquet Fund and pray that the + many struggling families receiving assistance may be uplifted by being both receivers and givers.

Prayer Focus this month: The Church of the Province of the Indian Ocean

WEEK 1

A Prayer for the Leadership of the Church and of the Nations



Have confidence in your leaders and submit to their authority, because they keep watch over you as those who must give an account. Do this so that their work will be with joy, not a burden, for that would be of no benefit to you." – Hebrews 13.17

All too soon we are in the ninth month of the year, and we invite you to join us to give thanks to God for His faithfulness. As we give thanks to God, we invite you to join us to pray for the Province of Indian Ocean, for the Primate, the Most Rev. Dr. James Wong Yin Song, and the Bishops of the constituent dioceses in Mauritius, Madagascar and Seychelles. Join us to lift in prayer the community and political leaders of the constituent countries and especially for the Rev. Canon Wavel Ramkalawan, the President of the Republic of Seychelles. Let us pray for wisdom, and for every virtue that these leaders and others require to rule the nations and to lead the Church of God in those countries.

WEEK 2

A Prayer for Mercy, Healing and Fruitfulness

And the Lord said, 'I will cause all my goodness to pass in front of you, and I will proclaim my name, the Lord. I will have mercy on whom I will have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I will have compassion'. - Exodus 33.19

In the second week of the month, we invite you to pray for the Lord's mercy, compassion, healing, and restoration on the people and communities of Madagascar, Mauritius and Seychelles especially as they continue to face the challenges of Climate Change induced conditions and as they rebuild back from the devastation of the cyclone season that happened earlier in the year. Join us to pray for the displaced, migrant workers and various categories of people in the three island states that they will contribute to the fruitfulness of the economies of the nations, foster healing, and healthy relations and that they will live in harmony with the Indigenous and show mercy one to another. Let us pray for the various ministries of the Church that provide health and healing and for all whose work brings healing and restoration to the sick, the traumatized and those challenged emotionally and psychologically. Join us to pray for the victims (mainly women and children) and perpetrators of domestic violence, and for all who work to help victims in that sector.

WEEK 3

A Prayer for Peace

Submit to God and be at peace with him; in this way prosperity will come to you. - Job 22.21

In the third week of the month, we stand in prayer for the peace of the nation states of Madagascar, Mauritius, and Seychelles. We pray for God peace and leadership in various church and national processes especially for the preparations towards national elections in Madagascar later in the year. Join to pray for peaceful social and political relations between various ethnic groups and peoples in the island states and for peaceful coexistence among people of all faiths and none.

WEEK 4

A Prayer for Love

May your unfailing love be with us, Lord, even as we put our hope in you.

– Psalm 33.22

In this fourth week, join us to pray for people of all faith and none in the island states of Madagascar, Mauritius, and Seychelles, that love will undergird all relations between faith, ethnic and communities. Let us pray that all people in the constituent dioceses of the Province of Indian Ocean will bear the burden of love and experience same in their personal and communal lives even as they undertake their various tasks and responsibilities; that their actions and thoughts will be directed by love for one another regardless of gender, ethnicity, creed, and nationality; that the ministries of the church will be motivated and undergirded by genuine love for all people of faith and none, acknowledging that all are created in the image and likeness of our Sovereign God. Pray for all who are socially disconnected, lonely and without social connection or support.
