
- Lord God, Your mercy reaches to the heavens, Your goodness knows no end.

Prayer Points from our Overseas Partners



The Anglican Church in Aotearoa, New Zealand and Polynesia

- Please pray for political parties and politicians in Aotearoa New Zealand as election campaigning begins in earnest (election is 14 October). We pray that party policies are honest and true and aimed at what is best for the most vulnerable.
- We pray for recovery efforts in the parts of the North Island devastated by Cyclone Gabrielle earlier this year and especially for Anglican church and marae which have been so engaged in response and recovery efforts.
- ✤ We pray for people who are struggling as a result of cost-of-living rises, especially those who have nowhere to call home. Thank you for all agencies that support those who are struggling and have lost their way and for the hope and light these agencies bring.
- We thank you for the energy and inspiration that Anglican youth in Polynesia are bringing to the climate change debate. We ask for forgiveness for the times we take your wonderful creation for granted.
- ✤ We pray for parishes across the country as they draw on resources focussed on the Five Marks of Mission that have been developed by Anglican Missions (https:// anglicanmissions.org.nz/). May they help inspire and bring to the forefront the needs of others.



The Church of the Province of South-East Asia

- Give thanks for the whole process of the election of the 7th Archbishop of the Province of the Anglican Church in South East Asia, as Provincial Synod delegates discerned together the right candidate to be our next Archbishop at the end of September
 - Pray for the upcoming Council of Churches of East Asia (CCEA) Bishops' and Executive Committee meeting which is to take place in Hong Kong from 19 to 22 October.

- ✤ Pray for the host, the Most Revd Andrew Chan, Primate of Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui and for the Chair, the Most Revd Brent Alawas, Prime Bishop of the Episcopal Church in the Philippines. Pray for a fruitful time of networking to enhance the works of the gospel in East Asia, to advance God's Kingdom in our region. Pray for safe travel of all delegates and meaningful fellowship.
- Give thanks for the upcoming consecration as Bishop and appointment as an Assistant Bishop in the Diocese of Sabah of the Rev Canon Kenneth Thien on 5 November 2023 at All Saints' Cathedral, Kota Kinabalu, Sabah. Pray for the Assistant Bishop-Designate that the Lord will prepare, equip and anoint him for the assignment that He has called him to take up. Pray that the Lord will supply all his needs and the needs of his family generously.
- Pray for the upcoming Provincial Gathering from 6 to 9 November 2023 in Kota Kinabalu, that representatives from the dioceses in our Province will have a meaningful time of fellowship to build a strong sense of partnership in the works of the gospel in our Province.

The Episcopal Church in Jerusalem and the Middle East

- Give Pray for the Guidance of the Holy Spirit for the Synod of the Diocese of Cyprus and the Gulf as they seek to elect a new bishop in the coming months.
- ↔ Pray for the search for bishop candidates for the Diocese of Iran.
- Pray for the start of the school year for teachers and children, especially in Jerusalem, where there is a dispute with the government over the use of Palestinian text books.
- ✤ Pray for an end to the war in Syria.



- Pray for a peaceful and constructive end to the political impasse
 in Lebanon, leading to a recovery from the country's 95% inflation over the past three years.
- Pray for a just and lasting peace between Israel and Palestine, leading to an end to the 56-year occupation of the West Bank and longtime blockade of Gaza.

The Episcopal Church in the Philippines

 Give thanks for the ordinations of deacons and priests throughout the ECP, especially Deacon Rashel Doyayag, the second ordination for the Visayas Mission Area. Pray that they will remain faithful and committed to their ministries, and that their communities may actively support them in their many challenges and responsibilities.



- Pray for candidates preparing for baptisms, confirmations and receptions, especially at upcoming patronal festivals, as they intentionally dedicate their lives to being disciples of Jesus
 Christ, and for their sponsors, that they may be dedicated to fulfilling their role of helping to nurture these new believers.
- Pray for the successful intervention of the National Food Authority council in new price setting for rice, that it will be effective in both improving farmers' incomes and ensuring a sufficient supply of rice to the nation.
- Pray for peaceful resolutions to the territorial disputes within the Southeast Asia region, especially for the ceasing of unauthorised incursions into the West Philippine Sea exclusive economic zone within the South China Sea resulting in the destruction of the marine ecosystem and economic loss for the fishing industry.
- Give thanks for the success of the ECP's Season of Creation environmental programs and activities, especially the Report of ECP Emissions Survey and the ECP Mission Center Eco-Park development plan, and pray that these may be the seeds of a renewed commitment to intentional love for God's creation.

Prayer Focus this month: The Anglican Church of Southern Africa (ACSA)

WEEK 1

A Prayer for the Leadership of the Church and of the Nations

He chose capable men from all Israel and made the leaders of the people, officials over thousands, hundreds, fifties and tens. – Exodus 18.25

Welcome to October, in which we invite you to join us to prayer for the Anglican Church of Southern Africa (ACSA) that they may continue to know and experience the faithfulness of God in every aspect of their mission and ministry. Let us pray for the Primate, **the Most Rev Dr Thabo Makgoba** and the Bishops of the constituent Dioceses (and countries – Eswatini, Lesotho, Namibia, South Africa and St Helena) that make up the province. As we pray for the Church, we join our hearts to also pray for the political, social, community and religious leaders of the countries within the province that in humility and diligence, they will acknowledge and accept the sovereignty of God over their nations, communities, and faith groups. Let us remember the leadership of South Africa (the dominant economy in the region) as they lead the nations and her peoples to face the various socio-economic and political issues facing the country. Let us remember the 75 and more people who have died in the fire outbreak that gutted a Johannesburg community, the bereaved families and for the repose of the souls of the deceased.

WEEK 2

A Prayer for Mercy, Healing and Fruitfulness

About Joseph he said 'May the LORD bless his hands with precious dew from heaven above and with the deep waters that lie below. ...with the choicest gifts of the ancient mountains and the fruitfulness of the everlasting hills ... – Deuteronomy 33.13-16

In the second week we stand in prayer that the Lord will show mercy, heal, and grant fruitfulness to the labours of the peoples and communities of the constituent nations of ACSA. We remember in prayer the people (from many parts of Africa and other countries) who sojourn especially in South Africa for honest labour that they (and their host country and communities) will live at peace and share in the blessedness of the land where they live. We pray that the Lord will show mercy to the afflicted, healing for the wounded in body, mind and spirit and make host communities and families fruitful in their endeavours so they can support those in need. Let us pray for the various ministries of the Church that provide health and healing and for all those whose work brings healing and restoration to the sick, the traumatized and those challenged emotionally and psychologically.

WEEK 3

A Prayer for Peace

The Lord turn his face towards you and give you peace.

– Numbers 6.26

In the third week of the month, we stand in prayer for the peace of the nations of ACSA and the various troubled areas within the countries and dioceses of the province. We pray that the God of peace will turn his face and speak peace in the various places and context where peace is needed and for the fulfilment of the desire for peaceful living together of brothers and sisters (Psalm 133) so that they may enjoy the blessings of the Lord on all sides. Join us to pray for ACSA's presence and participation in the various religious and ecumenical spaces that they will model a true prophetic presence and voice in these spaces and champion justice for all people and at all levels.

WEEK 4

A Prayer for Love

... but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love me and keep my commandments. – Exodus 20.5-6

In the fourth week of the month, we invite you to join us to pray for people of all races, tribes, faith and none in the constituent countries of ACSA, that love shall undergird all relations between all people, tribes and race in the region. Join us to pray that all people in South Africa, Namibia, Lesotho, Eswatini and St. Helene will bear the burden of love and experience same in their personal and communal lives even as they undertake their various tasks and responsibilities. Let us pray that the actions and thoughts of all peoples and communities in the ACSA region will be directed by love for one another regardless of gender, ethnicity, creed, and nationality; that the ministries of the church will be motivated and undergirded by genuine love for all people of faith and none, race, tribe and nationality, acknowledging that all are created in the image and likeness of our Sovereign God.

Zimbabwe

 Please pray for the people of Zimbabwe in the post-election counter accusations of unfair and partiality in the recent elections. Stand with us to pray for peaceful resolution to any misunderstanding and the opportunities to seek peaceful resolution to the issues at stake.

West Africa

Please join us to pray for peace in the largely French-speaking West Africa region and the countries of Guinea, Burkina Faso, Mali, and Niger where the military have taken overpower (which actions threatens the peace the stability of the entire ECOWAS region).
