The Council of Anglican Provinces of Africa Prayer Focus this month: The Church of Uganda

WEEK 1

A Prayer for the Leadership of the Church and the Nations

Remember your leaders, who spoke the word of God to you. Consider the outcome of their way of life and imitate their faith.

— Hebrews 13:7

We are in the eleventh month of the year and we invite you to join us give thanks to God for His faithfulness which are new every morning. As we give thanks to God, we invite you to join us to pray for the Church of Uganda, for the Primate, the Most Rev Dr Stephen Kazimba, and the Bishops of the constituent dioceses in Uganda. Join us to lift in prayer the community and political leaders of Uganda as we pray for wisdom, and for every virtue that these leaders and others require to rule the nation and to lead the Church of God in the country. Let us pray for the leaders of other faith communities within the country that enlightened by the Holy Spirit, they will pursue justice, peace and respect for each other in their various faith and clan communities.

WEEK 2

A Prayer for Mercy, Healing and Fruitfulness

But in your great mercy you did not put an end to them or abandoned them, for you are a gracious and merciful God.

- Nehemiah 9:31

In the second week of the month, we invite you to pray for God's mercy, compassion, healing, and restoration on the people and communities of Uganda remembering in particular those in the northern communities that border the troubled areas of DR Congo and those affected by various forms of conflicts, displacement and insecurity. Join us to pray for the many displaced persons (especially from South Sudan) being hosted by Uganda that will know the peace of Christ and safety under His everlasting arms. Join us to pray for the displaced, migrant workers and various categories of people of Ugandan origin across the world that they will contribute to the fruitfulness of the economies of their host nations, foster healing, and healthy relations and that they will live in harmony with the indigens and show mercy one to another. Let us pray for the various ministries of

the Church that provide health and healing and for all whose work brings healing and restoration to the sick, the traumatized and those challenged emotionally and psychologically. Join us to pray for the victims (mainly women and children) and perpetrators of gender-based and domestic violence, and for all who work to help victims in that sector.

WEEK 3

A Prayer for Peace

In peace I will lie down and sleep, for you alone, Lord, make me dwell in safety

- Psalm 4:8

In the third week of the month, we stand in prayer for the peace of the nation of Uganda – within her communities, among the various people groups and with her neighbours. We pray for God's peace and leadership in various church and national processes and for the pursuit of justice and godly actions in governance, commerce and trade, education and life molding actions and within the judiciary. Join to pray for peaceful social and political relations between various ethnic groups and peoples in the nation of Uganda and for peaceful co-existence among people of all faith and none.

WEEK 4

A Prayer for Love

Do not seek revenge or bear a grudge against anyone among your people, but love your neighbour as yourself. I am the Lord.

— Leviticus 19:18

In the fourth week of the month, join us to pray for endearing love among the various faith and tribal communities in Uganda, that love will undergird all relations between faith, ethnic and communities. Let us pray that all people in the constituent dioceses of the Church of Uganda will bear the burden of love and experience same in their personal and communal lives even as they undertake their various missions and ministries; that their actions and thoughts will be directed by love for one another regardless of gender, ethnicity, creed, and nationality; that the mission of the church will be motivated and undergirded by genuine love for all people of faith and none, acknowledging that all are created in the image and likeness of our Sovereign God. Pray for all who are socially disconnected, lonely and without any social connection or support.
