ABM AID stands with the Diocese of Jerusalem through the Good Friday Gift



ABM AID launches Myanmar earthquake emergency appeal



More than 3,000 people have been killed after a 7.7 magnitude earthquake hit Myanmar on Friday 28 March. The quake flattened large parts of Myanmar's two largest cities, with rescuers continuing recovery efforts. In response to a call for help from ABM's local partner, the Church of the Province of Myanmar, we launched an emergency appeal within 24 hours. ABM AID is raising funds for emergency relief efforts in Mandalay and Taungoo, where the situation is dire. Food packs, water and mosquito nets are the immediate needs of those displaced by the earthquake.
